

General Info

- REGISTER ... REGISTER. If you are staying at Prairie Camp overnight OR you are a cabin owner (staying or not), you must register at the Camp Office. Please make every effort to do this Monday!
- The first meal offered for sale in the Dining Hall will be Monday breakfast. Meal tickets may be purchased at the Camp Office. See page 15 for prices.
- There is a limited number of picnic tables for your use. Please return to designated area at the end of camp.
- The playground is for children through 5th grade. Parents, for their safety, please watch your kids. Bullying will not be tolerated!
- All vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas. Any exception would need a parking permit issued by the Camp Office.
- No wastewater is to be dumped on the ground.
- Please use the dumpsters behind the Dining Hall for your trash. If they are full, you cannot leave your trash on the ground. Bring it back after they are emptied.
- Please do not place large items (furniture, appliances, etc) in the dumpster. It is your responsibility to remove these items from camp.
- Prairie Camp is not responsible for lost, stolen, or broken personal property.
- The restrooms/showers will be closed daily for cleaning during the following times. Please plan accordingly and respect those cleaning.

Camp Guidelines





- All overnight campers & all Cabin Owners need to register at the Camp Office.
- All vehicles parked anywhere except designated lots must have a parking permit displayed in the front windshield.
- Alcohol, illegal drugs, tobacco, guns or other weapons, explosives, and foul language are strictly prohibited.



- Pets are not allowed at Prairie Camp.
- For your safety, shoes must be worn outside at all times.
- You must be 19 years old and out of high school at least one year to stay on the grounds without a parent.
- Everyone must be at their own cabins or RV sites by 11:30 p.m.



- No posting of signs without permission from Camp Director.
- All campfires must be in "camp-approved containers" and off the ground.
- Damage of any size must be reported to the Camp Office or Camp Director.
- All campers are subject to the authority of the Prairie Camp Director, and/or appointed sub-directors.
- Children should be supervised at all times and are not allowed on the playground during services.



- The playground is for children through 5th grade.
- Bikes, skateboards, hoverboards, etc. are not to be used on the grounds.
- All small motorized vehicles (golf carts, etc.) are for camp personnel and handicapped or elderly campers only. If you are handicapped or elderly, please get your permit from the camp office. (Full guidelines available upon request.)
- Speed limit on the entire grounds is 5 mph.





CABINS & RVs

CABINS

- Please park your vehicle in the designated parking areas, unless you have plenty of room by your cabin. If parking anywhere but the parking areas, you will need a Parking Permit issued by the Camp Office and your vehicle must not block any traffic lane at any time.
- We would like to use your cabin! If you could make it available for other rental groups, please let us know at the Camp Office or email Michelle@mcncd.org. You will receive 50% of income received from the use.

• Cabin fees for 2024 will be: Old Section—\$290 | New Section—\$400 This includes AC and accounts for rising utility costs.

CAMPERS / RVs

- Be sure your camper is completely contained within your site.
- Do not park your vehicles on a site beside you. There may be campers coming in late at night or later in the week.
- All holding tanks may be emptied at the dumping station on the south end of the camp by the ball diamond at no charge. You can also pay for on-site dumping scheduled for Wednesday. The cost is \$30. Sign up at the Camp Office.
- If you would like to reserve the site you are on for next year, you may do so until Wednesday, July 19, before the Camp Office closes for the day or at PrairieCamp.org. Beginning Thursday morning, any site not reserved may be reserved by someone else.
- RV sites for 2024 will be \$250. The required deposit is \$125 to reserve your site, with the balance due by June 1, 2024.



- RV Cancellation Policy: All but \$25 will be refunded to you if cancellation occurs before June 1, 2024. After June 1, there are no refunds.
- All RVs must be removed from camp by 8:00 p.m. Saturday, July 22. A \$25 per day storage fee may be charged for all RVs not removed.

STORM SHELTERS

In the event of severe weather, everyone should seek shelter in the area designated on the map on the next page. Please familiarize yourself with the areas.

If there is time, we will ring the bell continuously, as long as it's safe to do so. If you are in the tabernacle, and a tornado is imminent, turn the benches over and get under them. Remain in your shelter until an all clear is given.

MEDICAL EMERGENCY

When a medical emergency occurs, send someone to the Nurse's Office to use the walkie talkie or cell phone provided to contact the nurse on duty. Instructions are in the Nurse's Office.

In a non-emergency situation, it is the responsibility of the Camp Director or Camp Nurse to determine the course of action in contacting a doctor and the parents (if applicable).

FIRE EMERGENCY


Evacuate the building immediately and yell "FIRE!!" Do not enter a smoke-filled building! If you are evacuated from a building, go to the ball diamond or empty field west of the gym so that all can be accounted for. Stay there until the all clear is given.

If the fire is small and well confined, an attempt can be made to put it out with the fire extinguisher.

In all cases, call the fire department and contact the Camp Director, Ben Hahn.
