



TEEN CAMP GUIDELINES

- Dorm Campers must turn in vehicles keys to counselor upon check in.
- A parent signed Teen Camp Pass must be on file in order for a teen camper to leave the grounds for any reason.
- Teen Campers must wear wristband on wrist at all times. A replacement band may be purchased for \$1.00 at the Camp Office.
- All Teen Campers (Dorm & Campers@Large) are required to attend all activities and services.
- Evening tabernacle services: a) no hats or pajamas; b) check in at the main entrance before being seated.
- Bibles should be brought to all services and devotions. If you do not have one, please tell your counselor and one will be provided.
- The woods are off limits.
- No food or drink is allowed in the dorms. Creatures will visit you!
- Teen Camp does not allow any electronics, including cell phones, MP3 players, iPods, CD or DVD players, portable gaming devices, or lighters, matches, candles, knives, or any other weapons.
- Campers found in a cabin or restroom of the opposite sex will be sent home.
- No one is to be outside their dorm after 10:30 p.m. The only exception is for Campers@Large going to and from cabin time location.
- Lights out and quiet is 11:00 p.m.
- Campers who participate in unauthorized late night activities will be disciplined accordingly.
- Dress code: use basic modesty and your common sense! No 2-piece swimsuits and no speedos. Shoes and shirts must be worn outside the dorms. If there is a question regarding what is appropriate, ask your counselor.

ADDITIONAL CAMPER@LARGE GUIDELINES

- Campers@Large must attend a minimum of three services prior to going on any off campus activity.
- Camper@Large overnight stays in a tent or other housing must have parent / guardian stay in that same housing.
- All Family Camp and Teen Camp Guidelines apply to Campers@Large.

FAMILY CAMP GUIDELINES

- All overnight campers & Cabin Owners need to register at the Camp Office upon arrival.
- All vehicles parked anywhere except designated lots must have a parking permit displayed in the front windshield.
- Alcohol, illegal drugs, tobacco, guns or other weapons, explosives, and foul language are strictly prohibited.
- Pets are not allowed at Prairie Camp.
- When outside, please wear shoes.
- You must be 19 years old and out of high school at least one year to stay on the grounds without a parent.
- Everyone must be at their own cabins or RV sites by 11:30 p.m.
- Trees or buildings are not to be defaced in any way. Posting signs or banners may be done only with permission.
- This is your camp! Please respect the grounds as you would your own home. Feel free to help by picking up trash on the ground, wiping counters in the restrooms, and anything else that needs a little sprucing up.
- All campfires are to be in approved fire rings and off the ground.
- Please report any maintenance problems or damage to the Camp Office.
- All campers are subject to the authority of the Prairie Camp Director and/or appointed sub-directors.
- All campers are expected to attend all scheduled activities and services.
- Children should be supervised at all times and are not allowed on the playground during services.
- The playground is for children through 5th grade only and their parents.
- Bikes, skateboards, and rollerblades are not to be used on the grounds.
- All small motorized vehicles (golf carts, etc.) are for camp personnel and handicapped or elderly campers only. If you are handicapped or elderly, please get your permit from the camp office. (Full guidelines available upon request.)
- Speed limit on the entire grounds is 5 mph.
- Prairie Camp is not responsible for lost, stolen, or broken personal property.
