What does the verse say about the difference between the righteous and the sinner regarding their legacy? How does the contrast between the righteous and the sinner highlight the long-term impact of one's choices?

Why is leaving an inheritance considered a mark of wisdom and foresight?

Who benefits from the righteous person's actions according to the proverb?

How is the term "inheritance" used in this context-material, spiritual, or both?

In what ways can a person "prepare an inheritance for their children's children" beyond financial means?

How does this proverb connect with the broader biblical theme of stewardship?

HAVE A VOLUNTEER READ PSALM 112:1-3

What does it mean to "fear the Lord" in verse 1?

How is the person described who delights in God's commands?

Why do you think the psalm links obedience to God with blessing and prosperity?

How does "wealth and riches" in this context relate to spiritual versus material blessings?

How are wealth, descendants, and influence portrayed in this passage?

What does it mean to have a "lasting inheritance" and a "house established" in God's view?

How might generosity be connected to the "blessed" life described in these verses?

How can you cultivate a deeper delight in God's commands in your daily life?

APPLICATION

How does this lesson challenge your perspective on wealth, influence, and lasting impact? How does trusting God for provision and blessing change your perspective on money and success?

What steps can you take this week to leave a wise and lasting legacy for those who come after you?

How does this lesson challenge or encourage your understanding of true blessing?

What steps can you take this week to live in a way that aligns with the principles of Psalm 112:1–3?
