A WORD FROM OUR ELDERS

Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. Therefore, do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

Ephesians 5:15-17

If you are that parent or grandparent doing the preparations, who is carrying more stress, you or the student? What about the school teachers, staff and administration? Stress in the family is rarely a good thing; it leads to many misunderstandings and conflict that results in our making poor decisions that are not well thought out (unwise) or timely. Perhaps this would be a good time for church families who have students to begin to pray Ephesians 5:15-17 over or with your students, explaining it to them in age-appropriate terms. For those families who don't have students in their home, consider adopting a church family who does have students and pray this scripture for them daily.

Whatever stage of life we may be in at this point, we need to carefully study scriptures so that "we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into Him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love." (Ephesians 4:14-16)

Our ultimate and absolute goal should be to grow up in every way in Him, whether we are entering the first year of formal education or have been a believer for decades. If you are on a growth path, God bless you. If you're still being tossed to and fro by the waves, start small with something like Matthew 6:33 "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you".

There are times in all our lives, when we have such moments. The more we train our eyes to focus on the unseen, the more *our heart* and *mind* will seek it as well. We all have decisions to make and opportunities to inquire of God how to best communicate with or even represent Him to others on our daily journeys. Time in the scriptures and in prayer with Him daily becomes fuel toward equipping us for such moments. Please continue to ask God to use you to share with others how looking at eternal things impacts your life. As we focus our vision and thoughts onto eternal things more, it can inspire a fresh passion that reveals some decisions could be used as opportunities to live on mission to show the love of God and share the gospel of Christ with others. Perhaps, that could make a difference in and through our lives and others, both now and eternally.

Woodlawn Men's Ministry



The greatest need we have in America today is to reach our men.

There is an obvious need for developing men in their personal commitments to God, their family, and their church. However, studies show that only a small percentage of men will change through sharing and receiving information in a normal church service. Another group of men will never change regardless of what you try to do for them. The majority of men will make needed changes in their lives only after they have experienced intimate relationships with God and other Christian men. These same studies also have shown that the average man in the church has no or few close Christian friends with whom he can relate, share and learn. As the Men's Ministry we must provide the means by which men can learn to be men of God, turn their hearts toward God, their wives and children, their churches, and to the lost (Luke 14:25-35). We have the potential to see the greatest revival the world has ever known. God's Spirit is sweeping across this world, searching for men who are trustworthy to stand in the gap (Ez. 22:30).

Throughout history, revivals have stirred God's people. These revivals were sparked by prayer, repentance, humility, preaching of the Word, holiness, Christian service and saving the lost. These revivals, called awakenings, have brought about great spiritual and sociological change. They were pivotal in setting a direction for culture, law, education, business, ethics, and – above all – personal morality and integrity. The church and devotion to God became paramount in the family, church and community.

We are to strengthen our brothers (Luke 22:31-32) As men of Woodlawn Baptist and fellow believers in the body of Christ we are called to build one another into the men God has called us to be through encouragement, fellowship, and lifting one-another to be strengthened in the faith.

As the world has encroached its liberal view and since the "Second World War" the churches have turned most of their time to women and children and we have lost a generation of men to find themselves alone.

Men's Fellowship must be prioritized by all men in the church - whatever the age, demographic, or life stage - because Men's Fellowship is vital to a man's spiritual health.



MISSIONS



10 Not-so-stupid questions to ask about missions.

If you are thinking about missions, you probably have the answers to the big questions. But what about the usual day-to-day questions that seem silly and trivial? As the saying goes there are no stupid questions just stupid answers

Can I be a missionary if I am an introvert?

Some of the best missionaries are introverts. According

to Romans 12:6-8 and 1 Corinthians 12:4-11, God gifts each believer differently, but all are equipped to serve Him to be a light to the world. A humble introvert in many cases can be a more effective witness than an overbearing extrovert. God uses all kinds of personality types on the mission field. The big question is how is God gifting you to serve where you are currently? If you are not using your gifts to serve now you will not use them in missionary work.

How poor will I have to be to be a missionary?

There are multiple answers to this question. You do not have to take a vow of poverty to become a missionary. At the same time, becoming a missionary can also mean giving up the American dream. If the emphasis of the question is on the word "poor," then honestly, I would rethink how I look at finances from a biblical perspective before venturing out to become a missionary. Missions work requires financing. Missionaries are financed in a variety of ways. It is very rare but some missionaries are self-funded. Some take paying jobs overseas and become a light to their coworkers. The vast majority of missionaries have to raise funds. They ask for financial support from churches, individuals, and even businesses. The Pate family (our missionaries to Brazil) and Wade Lawing (our local missionary with FCA) fund themselves by this method, and so did my family who were missionaries to Scotland. There are many difficulties with this method. The biggest difficulty is that it is very hard to raise funds when on the mission field. As such they have to return home from time to time to raise additional funds. Southern Baptist missionaries are very fortunate because they are usually fully funded by the IMB. Fundraising is usually not a favorite job of missionaries. Secretly, most hate to have to constantly ask for money. Another question is what should be your salary? The pay of an average worker is a general rule of thumb that is used to calculate salary. There is a lot to take into account wisely. It is not only just the cost of living that needs to be considered but also unexpected costs like family emergencies or medical care that might require a trip back home. Other expenses include currency exchange rates, as well as taxes that may apply to both your host country and your passport country. You also have to consider how much of your income will be used towards financing your ministry until it can be self-funding. Some missionaries keep these separate and others do not. On one of our trips to Belize, I met a missionary in Independence that had one of the nicest, richest houses in the area. After talking to him, I realized he was more of a tour guide than a missionary. Locals did point to the extravagance of this so-called American missionary.
