A WORD FROM OUR ELDERS

Are you too rich to get into heaven? And before you answer, I would like to present you with a statistic and a verse. First, a stat I recently heard: 1/5 of the world's population is in extreme poverty and none of them live in the U.S. Secondly, Jesus words in Luke 6:20: "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God."

We read that verse and we are quick to point out that he is referencing the same teaching Matthew talks about in the Sermon on the Mount when he says, "poor in spirit." And we say he is not really talking about the poor. Instead of basing our conclusions on Matthew I think we should base them upon Luke's own retelling of Jesus' life. For Luke wants us to genuinely focus on what it means to be poor.

Luke 24 tells us that all of the Old Testament spoke about Jesus, so what does the Old Testament teach us about the poor as Jesus addresses them. I think Tim Keller summarizes the Old Testament understanding of the poor well: "You have little or nothing of what the world values." No skills, no abilities, no winning personalities, and no money. We get a glimpse of this in Proverbs 14:20 and 19:4, 7. In these verses we see that the poor are people who have nothing to offer the world so the world abandons them. Even the family and friend (singular) of the truly poor abandons them. Then Proverbs 13:23 says that when the poor are able to cobble together a meager profit, even that will be taken away through injustice because the poor can't stick up for themselves. And lest we draw any errant conclusions, four verses later after Luke tells us the poor are to be blessed, he further clarifies what he means by offering a contrast: "Woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation" (Luke 6:24).

As we read through this hopefully we become more aware of the poor. Our response however must go beyond making a commitment to give to the need or pledge to support a child in a third world country, for these efforts would miss what Luke 6:20 is telling us. For in Luke 6:20 Jesus is teaching the gospel. The gospel is for all those who recognize they have nothing to offer and never will, there is nothing they can give God in exchange for salvation. And not only does God take away their shame He gives them the entire Kingdom. To be poor, as Luke is describing, is to live in the knowledge that we have nothing to offer and it is only by the grace of God that our circumstances have changed. The person who perpetually lives in this knowledge is the person who is a Kingdom woman or a Kingdom man.

It is reassuring to see the clarity of God's Word in the above scripture. Directions are simple – seek Me, find Me. Often, we move right on in our reading of the passage and miss the "with all your heart" statement.

We attempt to surrender daily ourself as we deliberately spend with Him, yet things creep in that misalign our attitudes or priorities with those of His heart. He doesn't look for perfection, He chose to make us human – thus, in need of Him. He is quick to help us through our seeking repentance or His help in our areas of need. God sent His Precious Son, Jesus Christ for us.

As you seek God, remember this – HE <u>wants</u> to be found by each of us! A catholic priest from the 1500s, John of the Cross, stated "If you are seeking after God, you may be sure of this: God is seeking you much more. He is the Lover, and you are His beloved. He has promised Himself to you."

So, please enjoy His invitation to come and His availability! Continue seeking to read His Word daily and praying to Him daily. Those two activities are spoken of by numerous Christian leaders as the key to being in God's Presence – to finding Him. And, in HIS Presence, we will find what we need through HIS grace, love and faithfulness. Jesus Christ came for our hearts!

TCKs, MKs, Oh my! (series)

You are probably not familiar with this term and are wondering what a third culture kid is? It is a term that has become popular in the last 30 years or so to help understand missionary kids. The term "third culture kid" was first used by Ruth Hill Useem during her anthropological study of expatriates in India in the 1960's. It was further defined by American sociologist David Pollock. "A TCK (Third Culture Kid) is an individual who, having spent a significant part of the developmental years in a culture other than

the parents' culture, develops a sense of relationship to all of the cultures while not having full ownership in any. Elements from each culture are incorporated into the life experience, but the sense of belonging is in relationships to others of similar experience."

Another term that is used to describe TCKs are "global nomads". It is used to describe children of international families including government, business, military, missionaries and children of cross-cultural marriages.

Most people are born and raised in one country so they have had a very different experience from TCKs. TCKs are born in one country and then raised in one or more countries. The sense of most people's identity, nationality and belonging is not the same as a TCK. A TCKs life is very different than if they would have been raised in their own parent's "home" country. Not worse, just different. It also affects them as they mature. Research in 1996 that tracked TCKs for 20 years shows that 82% of TCKs still have international aspects to their lives and 42% live in countries other than their passport country.

TCKs are social chameleons in that they can blend in anywhere in a short amount of time. Adults take a long time to learn languages and customs but TCKs do it with ease as it is built into them.

A couple of biblical examples of TCKs include Joseph who was born in Canaan but spent time growing up in Egypt. Another example is Daniel who was from Jerusalem but grew up in Babylon.

In our next article about TCKs we will look at some of the characteristics of a TCK.
