A WORD FROM OUR ELDERS

God is Good All of the Time, And All of the Time God is Good

"Non-binary" has become a hot button term in society, specifically concerning gender. "Non-binary gender" is an umbrella term for anything that isn't solely male or female. Beyond our culture's popular use of the term in the gender conversation, binary/non-binary are simply terms that refer to the nature of something's composition. Binary means that something is composed of two parts. Non-binary means something is composed of more than two (or countless) parts. So, concerning gender, a binary understanding is that there is only male or female, and a non-binary understanding is that there are more options than that. One of the implications of a non-binary understanding is that someone has the ability to choose exactly what gender they are.

It seems that in the sinful decline of civilization this non-binary understanding of the world is accelerating at break-neck speed! This view of the world is contrary to God's design, and not just in terms of gender. God's creation is filled with good, binary distinctions. These distinctions are never less than rock-solid truths, but when embraced and held tightly they become so much more. To understand and embrace God's good, binary distinctions in creation is the path toward a vibrant, meaningful life of worship. Here are a few of those distinctions found in God's creation: Creator / creature, right (righteousness) / wrong (sinfulness), obedience / disobedience, male / female, husband / wife, parent / child. The list could certainly go on, but the point is that in any of these categories a person is either one or the other.

We all rebel against these distinctions at some point. We justify "small sins" that we know are wrong, making them right in our minds. We abdicate our responsibility as parents and let our children make the rules. Wives want to lead their husbands and husbands want to be led. Withholding the truth becomes honesty. Telling lies becomes loving. Why would human nature want to challenge these binary distinctions that seem so helpful and true? I believe it is because we don't trust the goodness of God.

Certainly, in part, this is a failure to acknowledge and respect the authority found in the Creator / creature distinction, but more specifically, it is not trusting in God's goodness. If we study Scripture's account of the fall, we will find Eve doubting God's goodness. She succumbed to the temptation to doubt God's goodness by believing that God's wanted to keep good things from her (Gen. 3:1-5). Because of this misunderstanding of God's goodness, Eve no longer trusts God and she takes matters into her own hands, determining right and wrong for herself (Gen. 3:6). Paul refers to this as exchanging the truth about God for a lie, and he says that it is a misunderstanding of the truth that distinguishes the Creator from the creature (Rom. 1:25).

God is good and he is our Creator. There are many things in life that we cannot choose but can only understand and embrace. Don't question God's goodness in the things he has decided for you. Rather, trust in his goodness and seek to understand how he wants you to live in the life he has given you.

James 1:27

We must seek to be "unstained by the world" but we do need help not to be polluted as one author said by the world. While we know 1 John 1:9 states we can be cleansed from all unrighteousness, we also know seeking to keep close to Christ can guide our heart into His Word regularly and that consistent prayer will keep us tender to talk to and hear from His Spirit. God desires to have that heart relationship with us – and will lead us into paths of light and life.

Below are three simple ideas one writer expressed as important when we seek to avoid the world's "pollutants." Perhaps you can add to the list some things more personal and even more obvious for believers, but recalling these can help us be stable in an unstable world of changing stains and choices on our journey of being wholly HIS!

- 1. Trust God with ALL your heart, even when you can't understand or see HIS method of help . . . HE is a good Father.
- 2. Surrender to HIS ways, even when they don't make sense to you . . . HE is the source of all wisdom!
- 3. Seek to focus on Him and remain in communication with Him through the Bible and prayer . . . HE sees you and HE hears you.

Being a child of God through the forgiving and powerful blood of Christ Jesus has benefits. HE will never leave us or forsake us – and HE will keep His word. Learn His promises and the benefits of being a child of God; and please, pray regularly for those who have not yet made that decision to follow Christ or who have wandered from the awesomeness of these truths and are living in the lie of spiritual defeat!

Thank you to those who prayed for students during the 2022-23 school year. Hopefully, the student whose name you chose last fall to pray for has grown closer to Christ and had a safe, successful school year. 

Woodlawn Men's Ministry



The greatest need we have in America today is to reach our men.

There is an obvious need for developing men in their personal commitments to God, their family, and their church. However, studies show that only a small percentage of men will change through sharing and receiving information in a normal church service. Another group of men will never change regardless of what you try to do for them. The majority of men will make needed changes in their lives only after they have experienced intimate relationships with God and other Christian men. These same studies also have shown that the average man in the church has no or few close Christian friends with whom he can relate, share and learn. As the Men's Ministry we must provide the means by which men can learn to be men of God, turn their hearts toward God, their wives and children, their churches, and to the lost (Luke 14:25-35). We have the potential to see the greatest revival the world has ever known. God's Spirit is sweeping across this world, searching for men who are trustworthy to stand in the gap (Ez. 22:30).

Throughout history, revivals have stirred God's people. These revivals were sparked by prayer, repentance, humility, preaching of the Word, holiness, Christian service and saving the lost. These revivals, called awakenings, have brought about great spiritual and sociological change. They were pivotal in setting a direction for culture, law, education, business, ethics, and – above all – personal morality and integrity. The church and devotion to God became paramount in the family, church and community.

We are to strengthen our brothers (Luke 22:31-32) As men of Woodlawn Baptist and fellow believers in the body of Christ we are called to build one another into the men God has called us to be through encouragement, fellowship, and lifting one-another to be strengthened in the faith.

As the world has encroached its liberal view and since the "Second World War" the churches have turned most of their time to women and children and we have lost a generation of men to find themselves alone.

Men's Fellowship must be prioritized by all men in the church - whatever the age, demographic, or life stage - because Men's Fellowship is vital to a man's spiritual health.



MISSIONS



VBS Missions

Every year at VBS we have a session for Missions. We have a primary country that we study and we watch a video series of a missionary family from that country. The Burkhalters were this year's missionary family working with the impoverished women of the Embera in Medellin, Columbia. Most of these women are uneducated and are refugees who fled their native homelands for safety. The Burkhalters noticed them begging for food and money and started to share the gospel with them. They also taught these women life skills to support themselves such as making fine-beaded jewelry and teaching them Spanish.

On Monday night we talked about the country of Columbia. Columbia is the 4th largest South American country and has the 2nd largest population of Spanish speakers. They have a population of over 50 million with four cities having more than a million people. 94% of Columbians have some sort of Christian religious background with only 10% identifying with evangelical faith. Sixty of the 96 people groups are considered unreached. This is why we need missionaries who will teach native Columbians who can reach these people groups. As part of the Twists & Turns game theme, the kids had a Fortnite dance-off.

On Tuesday night, Gabe gave a presentation on Japan. Japan has a population of 125 million people but only 3% claim any type of Christianity. He gave an amazing visual illustration. He filled up a serving pan with over 1000 white mints. Only a few of the mints were colored. The few colored mints among the many white mints represented the number of Christians in Japan. For their game, the kids became Samurai warriors as they used pool noodles to knock stuff off their heads.

On Wednesday night, Dylan (one of our students) gave a presentation on China. He gave a great gospel presentation and talked about how few Christians there are in China. He also mentioned that most Christians in China have to meet in secret because they are not welcome. For their game, they played a missions trivia tic-tac-toe.

On Thursday we talked about Germany. George Gates, our deacon of missions, recently went to Germany to meet and talk to the interns we are supporting. Germany's churches are very liberal. The interns are studying to take the gospel back to these churches. For our game challenge the kids had to use their feet to retrieve as many plastic bugs as they could from an ice-cold bucket of water.

Friday was our Family Night. We finished viewing our week-long missions video and then showed a gospel presentation video. After that, the silliness began. Our mission offering this year was for Least of These Carolinas - a Christian foster care organization

here in Gaston County. The children raised over \$400. A lot of kids emptied their piggy banks for this effort. As usual, there was a competition between the boys and the girls to see who could raise the most money. The boys won this year. We had two adult volunteers participate in our winner's celebration. The winner got to spin the Wheel of MisFortune and Ragan Norris had to eat a full course meal of baby food. The girls did a wonderful job raising funds as well so Chris Norris had his hair and beard spray-painted blue and pink. Then our classroom teachers came up on the stage to perform the Twists and Turns VBS theme song to show their kids how well they could do the motions to the song.

Special thanks to the missions volunteers Gabe, Dylan, Jonathan Calvert, Landon Calvert, and Evan Botts. Special thanks also to Ragan and Chris Norris for volunteering for our Missions Offering Celebration during Family Night.

Please pray that the seeds planted during VBS week will bring much fruit.
