A WORD FROM OUR ELDERS

The Formula for Trusting God

Life often feels out of control. Our imaginations about worst case scenarios lead to cycles of paralyzing fear and anxiety. Staying put and hunkering down become the only reasonable approaches to life. Everyone else seems so reckless. Life often feels unfair, too. We have lifelong dreams and desires that have never panned out. We watch as people who don't treat their families well and probably don't even love God seem to have blessing after blessing fall into their lap. Often, the reality of life isn't what we planned for at all. We doubt ourselves and ask questions like "Is there something else I could have done?", or "Did it really have to be this way?"

It isn't uncommon for us to experience life as some mixture of anxious, disappointed, and confusing. The fact that they are common doesn't mean that they are harmless. In fact, quite the opposite. These feelings, when unaddressed, can lead to outbursts of anger, a critical spirit, simmering bitterness, withdrawn resentment, and hopelessness. God wants us to rejoice and be glad (Ps. 118:24)! Throughout Scripture God calls his people to a disposition of gratitude and happiness. God wants us to work and live and thrive and flourish and have relationships and build community together! We can't worship God with our lives the way he instructs us to if we remain hindered by our sinful anxieties, disappointments, and doubts.

So, what is the solution? Should we "man up", "get it together", and magically learn how to "deal"? The answer is no. At this point, as most would agree, we've proven that we can't do it. The solution is to trust God. That answer might seem obvious and simple - easier said than done! Just ask anyone who has struggled with fear and anxiety. Trusting God is less about your ability to *do* something and more about your knowledge *of* something, or someone – God himself. We can't trust what is unfamiliar to us, so for starters we need to familiarize ourselves with God.

Let's think of this approach as a formula for trusting God. This formula for trust is made up of three *absolute* attributes of God and is therefore rooted in our knowledge of him. Here is the formula: Absolutely Sovereign + Absolutely Good + Absolutely Wise = Trustworthy. First, God is absolutely sovereign. He is the King of the universe. The Bible says that God does all that he pleases (Ps. 115:3), controls people's hearts (Prov. 21:1), makes both good and bad situations (Isa. 45:7), and is greater and more powerful than we can imagine (Isa. 40:9-26). Second, God is absolutely good. He is our Father in heaven. He is only light and in him is no darkness at all (1 John 1:5). He provides for us (Matt. 6:25-26) and sent his Son that we would have a life of true abundance (John 10:10). "Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just" (Gen. 18:25)? Lastly, God is absolutely wise. God's way is the best way and the best means for accomplishing his purposes. Scripture refers to him as the "only wise God" (Rom. 16:27). Job says that God is wise in heart and that his plans cannot be thwarted (Job 9:4; 42:2). The Bible even talks about how God intended his plans to seem like foolishness to the world so that those who trust in him would have to rely on him instead of themselves (1 Cor. 1:18-21). That's how wise God is!

If God is truly sovereign, and completely good, and the only wise God, shouldn't we trust him? Not based on our ability to trust, but on the basis of who he is! There is never a time that God isn't in control – and he is your loving Father in heaven who wants to do good in your life. Who else would we want in control? Ourselves (now *that's* something to be afraid of)? And we should never question if there was another way or a better way, God *knows* the best way to accomplish our good and his glory.

This is an invitation to come out of hiding. There is freedom in knowing God. Freedom to trust him and live life to the fullest and for his glory.





MISSIONS



10 Not-so-stupid questions to ask about missions.

If you are thinking about missions, you probably have the answers to the big questions. But what about the usual day-to-day questions that seem silly and trivial? As the saying goes, there are no stupid questions, just stupid answers.

#9 Can I bring my dog/pet?

This would be another wisdom decision with many factors to take into account. It would depend on your ministry area and how you are serving. Consulting the missionaries in that area would be a good idea. You need to take into account that when you first arrive on the mission field, you will be very busy getting accustomed to your new surroundings. This may place a strain on your ability to care for your pet. Your pet would need to be vaccinated and in general good health. You may also become separated from your pet as it may be quarantined in customs. It can spend up to 28 days in customs entering the US. Different countries will have different laws and timeframes for quarantine.

#10 Is there a place for "regular" Christians without special training?

A lot of potential missionaries often wonder if they have the right qualifications for missions. The mission field is full of "regular" Christians doing great things for the kingdom. There are stories of missionaries who have just jumped on a plane and set off for the mission field. While that is not advised, in many cases, a little special training significantly contributes to effective ministry.

Bonus: Can I get my local favorite foods on the mission field?

It depends. Sometimes, the only place to get your favorite comfort food from home is in a specialty store at an inflated price. In Belize, a gallon of Byers chocolate ice cream was \$32. Sometimes you can receive it in a care package assuming that the customs agent is not hungry. As a child, Kool-Aid or Welch's drink mix packages were like gold to us kids. On a return trip to the field, my mother once packed an entire suitcase full of southern grits to give as gifts to our fellow American missionary friends in Scotland.

I hope you have enjoyed this series "Not-So-Stupid Questions to Ask About Missions". Missionary life can seem complicated sometimes, so just ask your question. It may help clear up your misunderstandings and fears.
