### A WORD FROM OUR ELDERS

If "Unsaved Christian" sounds like a silly phrase or at best a confusing one, then I want to show you its origins in the Bible. The category of "Unsaved Christian" is the target of Paul's address in the opening verses of Romans 10.

Paul's desire and prayer is for "them" to be saved (v. 1). So who is the "them" that needs salvation? Paul goes on to provide a description, which conveys the basis for the category we have been describing as "Unsaved Christian." He says it is a person with "zeal for God" (v. 2), and yet he is praying they will "be saved" (v. 1). They want to be considered a child of God, but they need salvation. In other words, in the southeast in 2023, someone who has zeal for God but is not saved equals an unsaved but self-proclaimed Christian. They believe they will go to heaven one day because they have a good relationship with God. Someone who is zealous for God will tell you they are a Christian, put verses on their Facebook, and have a lot of familiarity with church lingo, like "Jesus died on the cross."

So what is the problem? The main problem is their zeal for God is "not according to knowledge" of the gospel (v. 2). They are "ignorant of the righteousness of God" (v. 3). Rephrase: they are ignorant of what actually makes a person right with God. So we might ask: what makes them feel like they are good with God? They have sought to "establish their own" way of being right with God (v. 3). Usually this is a combination of good works, and the belief that Jesus came so that God would overlook their mistakes - you know, we all make mistakes.

God has provided a way for us to be right with him through Jesus. "For Christ is the end of law for righteousness to everyone who believes" (v. 4) Rephrase: Jesus is the end of someone earning their right standing with God. Jesus has provided the right standing if we will trust in him. So what does Paul cite as the reason they want to rely on their own good works instead of Jesus? "They did not submit to God's righteousness" (v. 3). Rephrase: they are unwilling to *submit* to God's method of being in a right relationship with him. They are absolutely convinced their good behavior is what gives them a right relationship with God. But little do they know the final outcome of that logic is found in Matthew 7:22-23 "Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and cast out demons in your name, and do many mighty works in your name?' And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness."

So if they are ignorant of the truth and foolishly base their right standing on the belief they are "good people" or a willingness "to give the shirt off their back" or a comparison to others "who have done a lot worse," how can they be saved? The key word for Paul is "submit." We all must submit to the way God says we can be right with him (v. 3). Submitting in this way declares: I don't care what it costs me. I will give it all up to be right with God. As Jesus says, "whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it" (Mark 8:35).

As a church our response to this zealous-for-God person who needs salvation - the "Unsaved Christian" - must be to "preach the good news!" (Romans 10:15). Rephrase, invite someone who claims to be a Christian on the basis of their good works to *submit* their life to Jesus.

Isaiah 61:1-2

Jesus did tell us to be His light, to go and tell HIS story – the gospel. As His followers, we desire to be found faithful to that assignment which we know Jesus left to His followers, the Church. God gives us a very simple way to begin in this assignment from Him.

It begins on our knees as we pray for His heart to so impact our heart with His priorities that they become our priorities. We begin when we truly hurt for and with the ones we see who are broken hearted, captive to the lies of both man and hell, and may be living in defeat. The compassion of Jesus is reflected in His mission to seek and to save the lost and in His proclamation of the good news. Please join daily in October praying that His mission and ours are the same. Below is a prayer challenge to consider during October.

Consider setting an alarm on your phone for 10:02 daily to remind you of the Luke 10:2 scripture passage written below. Then, take an intentional moment from your day and pray asking God to raise up laborers for HIS harvest of souls. As you pray, ask God to reveal what *your part* is in answer to that prayer. God is at work changing hearts and it can begin by your prayers. Your simple prayer brings an exciting opportunity to make eternal differences for HIS glory and witness HIS kingdom grow! Perhaps someone you are already praying for God to call into a new or more faithful relationship with Jesus as their Savior and Lord will be one whose life is impacted when a fellow laborer is brought into their path. May God help each of us continue to earnestly pray for God to raise up laborers for HIS harvest of souls through this simple alarm. We may be living for such a time as this!

"He said to them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest."



## **MISSIONS**



### 10 Not-so-stupid questions to ask about missions.

If you are thinking about missions, you probably have the answers to the big questions. But what about the usual day-to-day questions that seem silly and trivial? As the saying goes there are no stupid questions just stupid answers

#### #6 How often can I come back home?

This depends on the type of mission work you are involved in. Typically, you can expect a trip home every 2-4 years. There are also some home trips for special circumstances such as medical and family emergencies. Studies and experience show that going home more than once a year harms mission work. Going home often destabilizes the work in the community you may be doing. It also hinders your adjustment to the culture which can take considerable time.

#### #7 How do missionaries date and find spouses?

By swiping right on the app like everyone else. I am joking of course. During our mission work, there were several single men and women who worked with us. Many of them met and fell in love as missionaries, others met and married local single men and women. Some met and married when they came back home. Just like everyone else's good love story, the circumstances for dating and courtship will be unique for each missionary.

#### #8 Can I learn the language from an app?

Communication is essential to mission work so most missionaries attend a language school. Many times, it is not easy. Our missionary Brian Pate struggled to learn Portuguese when he went to Brazil even though his wife is fluent in the language. One of the reasons my father chose Scotland over Mexico was so he did not have to learn a new language. Missionaries even hire tutors if they get stuck. Apps are good as a supplement or as a practice to these other efforts. It should not be your primary source for learning the language. The other drawback to just using an app is that it primarily teaches you the formal language. It does not teach you the normal everyday usage or even the local slang. Learning local slang is very important as a single word can have different uses between regions and people groups. One word may mean nothing to one people group but may be used as an insult to another. Building relationships with a local native speaker is the best way to learn any language.
