Throughout the years God has faithfully blessed A.M.O. with many projects to build for and reach, not only this generation, but the next one as well.

Arildo and Washington, two of our long time volunteers, have been the key people in making this happen these last few years. Arildo earned his engineering degree while working as a volunteer here at AMO and now uses his gifts for the Lords work.



Currently, they are working on the top floor of the vocational building where we will be able to house students, volunteers and visitors. The bottom floor will be used for vocational training (wood shop, electrical , mechanical , paint shop) and as a tool room for equipment to maintain the A.M.O. Campus. We have future plans to transfer the vocational trades to another location on the property as we grow this ministry. Please pray with us as this project is a step of faith and we do not have designated funding yet for the windows, doors, plumbing, electrical, flooring, etc.

Praise the Lord, a team of 13 men from LifePoint (Smyrna, TN) will be coming at the beginning of June to help put on the roof, install the electrical work, paint Jessica's and Nate's missionary home, and build a large chicken coup. In addition to all this they will be a part of ministering to our churches in Sao Paulo, Varzea Paulista, Campinas and Jarinu. The A.M.O. team is looking forward to spending time working together, witnessing, worshipping, teaching, sharing the gospel, and ministering to the needs of the people.



Nate is doing an incredible work pastoring in our Campinas church along with our Campus team. We were recently blessed with high school students from Tennessee who took over to lead worship on a Sunday night service. Even though they had no experience, and had never done that before, they were great!

They were also great at stepping immediately into the ministry work by arriving at the airport and going directly into the two favelas in Sao Paulo, Cachoeirinha and Favela Vila Nova, where we minister. They visited people in their homes, played activities on the open field, and many shared the gospel using the Evan-geCube. God was moving as people came up front repenting of their sin and recognizing that Jesus bore their sins and failures bodily on the cross. Thanks to Pastor Ryan for his convicting messages!
