It's time for Faith Journey Lutheran to move toward completing the ministry profile that will help our synod staff find candidates for a call committee to consider for future

leadership. As I am preparing to guide that process, I am learning that there are different kinds of problems and challenges before us. Some are technical and some are adaptive.

Technical problems are those that can be addressed with existing resources and expertise. For example:

Our website desperately needs an overhaul!

Our constitution needs to be updated to bring it into line with how we are actually structured now.

We will have several issues to tackle as the old building comes down.

We have some issues with the maintenance of our building and property.

We need to assure that important pieces of ministry previously managed by paid staff, which have been cut, are covered somehow.

Adaptive challenges are more challenging. Examples of adaptive challenges would be:

Established ways of worship and faith formation are not speaking to younger generations and they are abandoning church. We are not sure what might work better.

Our congregational structure and business model of membership, pledging and volunteerism is breaking down and we are not sure what will replace it.

People in our congregation don't feel comfortable naming how they sense God's presence and activity in their lives. Many cannot identify their source of hope.

The technical problems are clear. We can simply decide to fix something or change it for the better. We

raise some money to buy some new piece of equipment. A new p.a. system was installed and some worn out carpet was replaced recently, for example.

Adaptive challenges have no easy answers. They require new learning and more discernment together.

Over the next several months we will be thinking a lot about our congregation's very reason for existing. We will examine our priorities. We will ask questions of our problems and challenges. Are they more technical or more adaptive?

For some things we will simply make a plan and do something (anyone want to serve on a constitution review committee?)


But what kind of challenges baffle us? These are the ones we might rather not face. When we begin with the question "We don't know how to...?" we are moving into the territory where we must pray for guidance by the Holy Spirit. The definition phase of innovation brings us to the question "HOW MIGHT WE...? How might we, LORD?"

God is faithful. If we are open to the movement of the Spirit, especially when we are led out of our comfort zone for the sake of the wellbeing of our neighbors, I believe that we will have opportunities to see God doing a delightful new thing. How might we?



Elder Abuse

Abuse happens to youth but is also common with our elderly population. Older adults can be seen by predators as easy prey. Friends and family members are encouraged to watch for potential signs of abuse. Four possible signs to observe are:



- Physical signs: bruises and broken bones. However, not all harm is visible. Poor Hygiene, decreased appetite or weight loss may also indicate mistreatment.
- Financial irregularities: Inability of a person to access their financial accounts or incurring sudden large expenses. Scams may be the reason, but money may also be taken or spent by a caregiver or family member.
- Unusual behavior with a caregiver or other individual. Has this behavior changed during your observation of the person when the caregiver or other person is present? The behavior may be distancing or overt friendliness and flirting.
- Emotional, social or cognitive changes. Aging individuals sometimes exhibit depression, anxiety and confusion but these could also be symptoms of abuse. Withdrawing from their usual social activities is a common sign.

As you observe loved ones, watch for these changes or others. If you become concerned about these observations, contact someone. A counselor, therapist, pastor or a member of the Caring Ministry Team may be able to help you.





What you do:

- Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- 5. Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- 6. Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then watch your plants grow!




