LifeGroup Discussion Date: February 12, 2017

Psalm 119:41-48

1. Read Psalm 46. How does Psalm 46:10 relate to Psalm 119:41-42? When is a time that you have waited for the Lord?
2. Psalm 119:45 says that the psalmist shall “walk in a wide place” where there is safety and security. How can God’s Word provide us safety and security?
3. The early parts of this stanza speak about listening to the Lord and waiting on him. In the end of the passage, what are the things the Psalmist is enabled to do because of God’s love toward him?
4. The theme of this stanza is “the Lord is my security.” How does God’s loving-kindness or grace serve to provide security to God’s children?
5. What is hopelessness? How has God’s word and the church helped you during times of hopelessness?
6. Do you ever feel embarrassed or uncomfortable to share God’s word with others? Why? Read Psalm 119:46. What is it that enables God’s people to speak God’s word without shame?
7. Family verse: Read and memorize Psalm 119:41. Discuss the importance of waiting for the Lord and why it is so difficult.
