1. In what ways does the popular atheism in American culture affect your Christian witness? How do you respond to those who claim to be atheists?

2. What role does listening play in your evangelism and apologetics? How might asking good questions help you to better share your faith?

3. What does Psalm 19:1 tells us about "natural revelation" (natural revelation is the understanding that nature reveals things to us about God)? How does Paul explain natural revelation in Romans 1:18-23?

4. What did God use to get your attention before you were a Christian? What role did Scripture play in your salvation experience?

5. According to Psalm 19:7, how does God's word point us to the Lord?

6. St. Augustine famously said, "Our hearts are restless until they find their rest in thee, O Lord." Read Ecclesiastes 3:11 along with Psalm 19:12-14. Why are we restless without God's presence in our lives?

7. Family verse: Read and memorize Psalm 19:14. Use this verse this week in your family prayer times.
