## **LifeGroup Discussion**

Date: April 2, 2017

**Psalm 119:89-96**

1. Based on the sermon from last week, what can we learn from nature and the created world? Why is it not as trustworthy as what we can learn from the Bible?
2. What is the primary purpose of the Bible? Why shouldn't we be surprised if it doesn't answer all of the questions we have related to science and other subjects?
3. Read Psalm 119:90-91. What role does God's power and providence play in maintaining the created order?
4. According to Psalm 119:92, what kept the psalmist from perishing in his affliction? How can the God's word sustain you in difficult days?
5. Verse 96 says, "I have seen a limit to all perfection, but your commandment is exceedingly broad." How is God's word more comprehensive and valuable than the greatest perfection we can find in nature?
6. Recently a pastor from a liberal-leaning denomination argued against a particular theological position because it "hurts my feelings." How can we lovingly engage with those who elevate "feelings" over doctrine? How can we avoid the same error in our own lives?
7. Family verse: Read and memorize Psalm 119:89. Discuss what it means for our lives for the Word of God to endure forever.
