LifeGroup Discussion

Date: June 11, 2017

Psalm 119:161-168

1. The psalmist writes “My heart stands in awe of your words.” What is awe? How can we grow in our sense of awe toward God’s word?
2. How might increasing our sense of awe at the created world enable us to experience a greater sense of awe toward God and his word?
3. In verse 162, the psalmist tells us that he rejoices at the word like one who “finds great spoil.” How can you value God’s Word as “great spoil?”
4. Sometimes we can see God and his word as necessary or even valuable, but not a source of joy. What keeps you from rejoicing in God’s word?
5. Pastor Craig talked last week about the value of learning God’s word early in life so that you can remember and reflect upon it as you age. How have you been blessed by reflecting on God’s word?
6. In verse 166, the psalmist claims his hope for salvation. Scripturally, to hope means to expectantly wait. How does God’s word give you a confident expectation in his ability to save?
7. Family verse: Read and memorize Psalm 119:165. Why do those who trust in God’s word not stumble?
