1 Corinthians 10:23-31

1. Some people suggest that God is egotistical because he is concerned with bringing glory to himself. Why is this allegation against God wrong?
2. This passage of Scripture speaks primarily to the eating of meat that might have been sacrificed to idols. How does “eating to the glory of God” help to overcome any concerns related to one’s conscience?
3. How does your personal testimony glorify God for what he has done on the cross and in your own personal life?
4. Jesus said in Luke 19:40 that if the people around him were silent, “the very rocks would cry out.” What does this verse teach us about God’s glory (hint: Isaiah 6:3 gives some insight into the relationship between the creation and the glory of God)?
5. How are we glorifying God for what he can do when we share the gospel?
6. One of the goals of the protestant reformation was to help lay people to see God’s calling in their lives. God has called you to serve him in the situation you find yourself in right now. How can you glorify God in your work or school life this week?
7. Family verse: Read and memorize 1 Corinthians 10:31. What can you do as a family this week to glorify God?
