## **LifeGroup Discussion**

### **Genesis 12:1-3**

1. Often when we talk about the call to missions, we limit that call to a specific call to international missions. How has God called us to missions through his Word?
2. Abraham's call began with a word from the Lord. What was that word? How is that call similar to the Great Commission?
3. God did not give Abraham specific promises until Genesis 12:7. What did Abraham have to do before he received clarification from the Lord? What step of faith might you need to take before you receive further clarity of his plans for your life.
4. As we work toward God's plan in our lives, we can sometimes feel as though we are wandering in the wilderness. God used Abraham's journey of faith to teach and test him. What lessons has God taught you on the journey toward your calling?
5. When we serve the Lord, we are not doing a new thing, we are just joining in the work that the Lord has already started. Where could you join the Lord in his work today?
6. What do we learn in this passage about God's heart for the nations? How does God's missionary heart in the Old Testament relate to the arrival of Christ in the New Testament?
7. Family verse: Read and memorize Genesis 12:1. Talk together about the steps God may be calling you to take right now.
