LifeGroup Discussion

Date: January 13, 2019

Ephesians 5:15-18

1. Read Eph. 5:15 and James 3:17. What does it mean to walk carefully as Christians? What are some real-world examples of this in action?
2. Read James 3:14. How would you contrast the difference in walking unwisely and wisely? What did Paul have in mind when he wrote this to the church in Ephesus?
3. Paul mentions making the best use of time in verse 16. What are some things we could do or not do when it comes to using our time wisely?
4. Paul also states that “the days are evil.” What does this mean then and now? How should thinking about the evil in the world motivate a child of God?
5. In Ephesians 5:17, Paul says not to be foolish and to understand the will of God. What is one of the most effective ways we can understand God’s will?
6. How do you think being filled by the Holy Spirit would affect your walk with Christ? How do we stay controlled by His Spirit? Read John 14:26, Gal 5:16, and Rom. 8:26.
7. Family verse: Read and memorize John 8:31-32. Talk about what it means to live as a disciple of Jesus.
