Discussion Questions

Psalm 100

1. Abraham Lincoln designated the first Thanksgiving in the United States by presidential proclamation. Why is it important for us to have particular time set aside for showing thanksgiving to the Lord? How are these particular times different from our everyday acts of thanksgiving?
2. Read Psalm 100:1-2. What kind of mood do you think the Psalmist would encourage as a part of worship? Do you worship in the way that the Psalmist encouraged?
3. In Psalm 100:3, we are urged to “Know that the Lord, he is God.” Is it possible to worship God in a wrong way? How can we protect ourselves against that error?
4. Read Exodus 34:5-9. What did God reveal about himself to Moses? How does God’s self-revelation to Moses and to us through his Word help us to worship him more faithfully?
5. Last week, Pastor Craig urged us to thank God for his faithfulness. Take time to share some of your thankfulness toward God with your LifeGroup this morning. Celebrate God’s faithfulness together.
6. Psalm 100 is the only Psalm that is designated as a Psalm for “giving thanks.” How might you use this Psalm as a part of your Thanksgiving time with your family and friends?
7. Family verse: Read and memorize Psalm 100:4. Discuss how you as a family can better prepare to enter into worship with thanksgiving and praise.
