## **Discussion Questions**

**Mark 14:22-25**

1. Do you remember the first time you took the Lord's Supper or a particularly meaningful time you took the Lord's Supper? What stands out to you about that moment?
2. Based on John 13:21-30, it appears that Judas left Jesus before the institution of the Lord's Supper. Why is this important and what implications does it have for the observance of the Lord's Supper today?
3. Read 1 Corinthians 11:17-22. How would you describe the scene of the Lord's Supper among the Corinthians? What were they doing wrong and how did their sin affect the unity of their church?
4. Paul gives warnings to the Corinthians and to all of us who would partake of the Lord's Supper in 1 Corinthians 11:27-34. How can we "judge ourselves" so as to not take of the Lord's Supper in an unworthy manner?
5. In the last century, some have tried to make Christianity more palatable by de-emphasizing the symbolism of blood. Why must the blood of Jesus be a primary subject within the Christian community?
6. How can the Lord's Supper be evangelistic? How might you use the Lord's Supper to explain the gospel to a friend or to children?
7. Family verse: Read and memorize 1 Corinthians 11:26. Discuss the importance of regularly proclaiming the Lord's death.
