Discussion Questions

Hebrews 3:16-4:7

1. Talk about a time when you have seen or heard a coworker or a family member claim to know the right thing to do, even though they did the wrong thing. How often do you do the wrong thing even though you know it is wrong?
2. Pastor Craig talked Sunday about some common sayings that are actually not in the Bible. What are some common sayings that do have a biblical basis?
3. Listen to God's truth. Read Joshua 1:8 and Job 23:12. What do these verses tell you about the value of God's word? How can you do a better job of listening to God's truth regularly?
4. Read Jeremiah 17:9 and 1 Peter 5:8. What do these verses teach us about our hearts and about how the devil might seek to ruin us? Why must we regularly use God's word to tell ourselves the truth?
5. Read James 1:22. What is the main idea of this verse? How can you apply it today?
6. Read Hebrews 3:6-7. How does this verse give us hope to know that it is never too late for someone to be saved?
7. Family verse: Read and memorize Hebrews 4:7b, "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts." How can you make sure that your heart is not hardened to God's word today?
