## **Discussion Questions**

### **Hebrews 4:8-13**

1. Submission is sometimes seen as a bad word in American life. Discuss a time when it was good you to submit or obey even though you didn't want to. Why were you so resistant? What was the outcome?
2. Read Acts 2:37-41. What was the response from those who heard Peter's sermon at Pentecost? What did Peter tell them was necessary for them to be saved?
3. Can you name a time when a sermon, a Bible study, or even a personal quiet time seemed to be directed right at you? How did it feel when God spoke to you that way? What was your response?
4. Read 1 Samuel 16:6-13. Why did God reject all of David's brothers? What did God see that Samuel couldn't see? What does God see when he looks at your life?
5. Pastor Craig pointed out on Sunday that we can't judge the intentions or motives of another person. How have you been tempted to do that in the past? How has doing so negatively affected your life?
6. Read Luke 6:45. What do your words and your actions tell the world about what is in your heart? How might you work to be a better witness for Christ?
7. Family verse: Read and memorize Hebrews 4:12. Discuss the power of the Word of God and how it has changed your life.
