Discussion Questions

Hebrews 4:14-16

1. Most people have a “safe” person they can turn to when life gets hard or scary. Who do you turn to when you have hard times in your life? How do they help you navigate difficult situations?
2. Read Psalm 121. How can this Psalm help you to trust Christ in hard days? What confidence does this Psalm give you in dark days?
3. On Sunday, Pastor Craig urged us to “look to Jesus” when we are afraid. Read Isaiah 43:1-4. Based on those verses, how do you think Jesus will respond to us when we run to him?
4. The writer of Hebrews urged his readers to hold fast to their confession. What is our confession? How can our confession give us strength?
5. Hebrews 4:16 says, “with confidence, draw near to the throne of grace.” Why can you draw near to God with confidence in prayer?
6. Read John 14:1-4. Jesus spoke these words to his disciples shortly before his crucifixion. How did these verses give encouragement to Jesus’ disciples to not be afraid?
7. Family verse: Read and memorize Hebrews 4:16. Discuss why prayer is important in your personal life and for your family.
