4. The Pharisees and the disciples of John were fasting and praying for the coming Messiah, but didn't recognize him when he arrived. Has there been a time in your life when you or someone you know didn't recognize the answer to prayer when it arrived? What can you do to make sure you recognize answered prayers?

Luke 5:33-39

1. Over the last eleven weeks, we have looked at the beginning of Jesus's ministry in the book of Luke. What has been your favorite passage or sermon? How has this time in Luke impacted your understanding of Jesus's earthly ministry?

5. Read 2 Corinthians 5:17-21. How has Christ made his people new? What is the ministry of reconciliation and how can we be ambassadors for this ministry?

2. The passage we studied this week opens with a conversation about fasting. Why did Jesus's disciples not need to fast? Read Acts 13:2. How and why might fasting be a Christian discipline today?

6. In Psalm 51:12, David prays after his sin with Bathsheba for God to "Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit." How can sin rob us of the joy of our salvation? Are there other things that can threaten to rob us of the joy of our salvation? How can we fight to maintain our joy?

3. Pastor Craig urged us to all beware of comparisons. What sorts of comparisons have caused you to struggle in your Christian journey? Is there a way that comparisons can be beneficial?

7. Routines are a good thing, but routines can sometimes blind us to the great things God is doing around us. What are some things you have seen recently that God deserves praise for?
