

1. How did you see God's power to work through our church demonstrated during the testimonies, interviews, videos, and stories in the sermon last week? Which story of God's work impacted you most? How have you or your family personally benefited from the ministries at Malvern Hill?

5. Mary traveled to see Elizabeth because she needed encouragement and confirmation. Who has God used in your life to strengthen your faith during a season of uncertainty, and how can you be that kind of encourager to someone else this week?

2. Do you feel more naturally drawn to giving, going, or serving? Why? How are you involved in ministry outside of the church? Where might we as a church improve in our mission and ministry engagement?

6. When you look at the "Year in Review" graphic, and consider the places we serve and the impacts defined numerically, what stands out to you most? Why? What is one ministry God might be prompting you to explore?

Why do you think generosity is such a vital part of missions? Which is harder for you personally: going or giving? Why?
