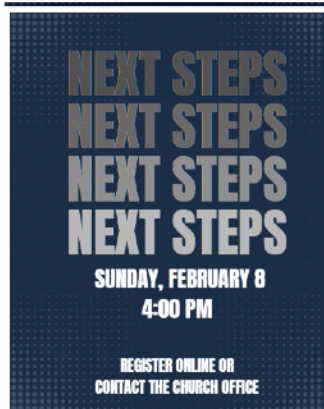

Luke 6:6-11

1. According to Luke 4:16, what was Jesus's custom on the Sabbath? Why is it important that we make worship a part of our regular custom on Sundays? Why do Christians worship on Sunday (the Lord's Day) instead of Saturday?

2. Twice in Luke 6 Jesus encounters opposition from religious leaders about how he behaved on the Sabbath. According to Luke 6:5, what gives Jesus the authority to redefine Sabbath? How does Jesus make a claim to divinity in Luke 6:5?

3. Jesus acted (or served) on the Sabbath multiple times (Mark 1:21-28, 29-31; Luke 6:10; 13:10-17; 14:1-6 John 5:1-18; 9:1-16). How might you worship the Lord through service on Sundays?

4. Luke makes it obvious on several occasions in Luke 6 that the religious leaders were watching Jesus (6:2, 6:7, 6:11), but they did not worship Jesus. How might people in 2026 watch Jesus (or Jesus's followers) but not worship him? What is the difference between watching and worshipping?

5. The Word of God is living and active and every word of it is to be treasured, but there are times when Jesus was teaching as much through his actions as through his words. How is the message of Christ in Luke 6:6-11 more than his words? How can you make sure that your testimony is more than your words?

6. The scribes and Pharisees were filled with fury because they resented the work of Jesus. How can resentment rob you of the good things in your life? How can you fight against resentment?

7. Sabbath (or rest) has been a regular theme in several sermons recently. Read Hebrews 4:9-11. How does this tell us to enter God's rest? How does this show that Christ fulfilled the Sabbath?
