Luke 6:17-19

1. On Sunday, pastor Craig talked about the necessity of churches raising up teachers and leaders. Who is your favorite pastor of all time, or maybe your favorite sermon? Why? What was so impactful about it?
2. This week's sermon is really only understood within the larger context of Luke 6-7. How can taking scripture out of context cause you to misunderstand its meaning? Describe a time you were confused about a passage of Scripture (or even misused Scripture) because you read it out of context? How can you avoid misunderstanding Scripture in your Bible reading?
3. The Bible does not give us much information about why Jesus chose the particular men called apostles, but it does give us information about the kinds of men who should be trusted to lead in the church. What are the character qualifications for elders listed in Titus 1:5-9?
4. In 1 Timothy 3:1, Paul writes, "If anyone aspires to the office of overseer, he desires a noble task." What should a person be doing right now if they aspire to lead in their church? What steps could you take to make yourself more qualified to lead within our church?
5. In 6:18, Luke makes a clear distinction between those who were healed of disease and those who were troubled with unclean spirits. What does this teach you about Jesus's care for individuals, even among such a massive crowd? What does this teach us about trusting the Lord for both physical and spiritual healing?
6. Luke writes in 6:19, "And all the crowd sought to touch him, for power came out from him and healed them all." How is the invitation to the crowd to be healed different from the call to lead?
7. Jesus appointed twelve apostles as the foundation for his church. Paul raised up pastors and missionaries and sent them out to plant churches and fulfill the Great Commission. As our church tries to raise up leaders to advance the gospel, what steps do you see are available, and can you think of other steps we could take?
