Luke 6:46-49

1. One of the most difficult things about being a Christian is seeking to live differently from the world around you. What are some things about Christians that should be different from the world around them? How do you work to cling to Christ in a world that does not celebrate faithfulness to Him?
2. Look at the context around Luke 6:46-49. How does the message about building your house on the rock align with Jesus's teaching about judging others and about a tree and its fruit?
3. As you consider the original audience to whom Jesus was speaking, how would this passage have impacted them? Why might they have called him Lord, but didn't do what he said? How is the original audience similar to the people in the Bible belt today who hear this message from Jesus? How are they different?

4. Read Ecclesiastes 12:12. How do we balance this warning about too much study with the obvious need to learn as much as we can about the Lord and about serving him?

5. Read 1 Samuel 15:22 and Matthew 9:13. On Sunday, Pastor Craig said, "There is no depth without discipline." Why is obedience a necessary requirement for discipleship? Why do people sometimes seek to prioritize the number of sermons they've heard, or the books they've read, or the Bible studies they have completed, rather than simple obedience?

6. The people building houses in this parable can't control the storm or the stream; they can only control their decisions. In many ways, control in this life is an illusion. Why is regular surrender to Jesus our only real hope to prepare us for the storms of life when they come?

7. Faith is the foundation of our spiritual lives. Our only hope for salvation is Jesus's grace and mercy. But the moment of our salvation is only the beginning of our spiritual journey. How do we build on the foundation of faith?
