Sometimes life really throws you for a loop. This past Thursday I got a phone call from my sister Tammy. I was sitting in Donna Jamar's office having our early-morning huddle and considered not answering the call, but something told me to answer. Immediately I knew something was wrong, as panic and sadness filled my sister's voice. She proceeded to tell me that close family friends had both been shot, the husband was dead and the wife was being taken by air ambulance to Tulsa for emergency surgery. Unfortunately as the details came out over the next 24 hours, the picture was one of a terrible accident: a husband startled awake by what he thought was an intruder, a gunshot to the abdomen of the wife, and in what I can only assume was unbelievable panic, fear and grief, a self-inflicted, life-ending final gunshot. A terrible tragedy that leaves a wife of 45+ years alone and confused, 2 adult children without their father, 5 grandchildren without their beloved grandfather, and many of us missing a dear friend.

The last couple days have given me the opportunity to "practice what I preach" with regards to death and dying. When I meet with a family in the wake of a loved-one's loss, I always encourage them to do 2 important things: 1) remember the Gospel message and 2) remember their favorite stories from their loved-one's life. And so in my article this week I want to do those 2 important things...and I appreciate you allowing me to use this public space to process a very private hurt in my soul.

When I was 8 or 9 years old, the Danny Ross family started going on yearly ski trips with the Matthews'. One year we went to Keystone, CO during winter break. While riding up the Gondola to the top of the mountain, I vividly remember Danny telling one joke after another and laughing at the top of his lungs. He laughed so loud that his kids and I told him he was embarrassing us. Wrong thing to do! Danny just laughed louder and in more bizarre ways to ensure the embarrassment was thorough. Danny was also a great athlete in his youth and so he was always a staple on our church softball team and a great partner in several benefit golf tournaments, including several benefitting Camp Egan, which many of you know is near and dear to my heart. When Shannon and I were looking to purchase our first house, Danny (a realtor) was our guide...and source of great comic relief as we looked at some weird color schemes and wallpaper! At one house we walked up to, Danny got the keys from the lockbox, opened the door, took one step in, immediately turned around, closed the door, replaced the keys and headed for the car. We stood there wondering what was going on when Danny looked at us and said, "Trust me...you weren't gonna like that one...just saving us some time!" Although it's been quite some time since I've seen or talked to Danny, I will never forget the time we shared.

I will so never forget the promises made to Danny in scripture. Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, though they die, shall live. And whoever believes in me will never die." Danny was a believer. I've come to learn that Danny had been quite sick and unable to leave his house. My buddy Chris told me he hadn't seen Danny in church for some time...but Danny managed to make it to Ash Wednesday service on the last night of his earthly life. I know today Danny's earthly sickness is healed as he is worshipping in the presence of the Lord. And while I will miss him, I know I will see him again some day...and for that I give thanks to God!

I thank you for allowing me to process Danny's passing in this public forum...and I encourage you, in the wake of death and dying, to remember the promises made to all who believe in scripture, and tell your stories over and over again of lost loved ones and friends.

That's all for now, have a great week, and hope to see our friends again, next week for Dinner at the park.

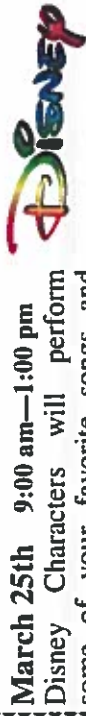
News from Ada Early Childhood Center
