Minimal Expectations for a Corinth Deacon

- Monthly Deacon Meeting Attendance is expected bearing unforeseen circumstances. Meetings usually take place the first Tuesday night of each month.
- Quarterly Business Meeting Attendance at least 2 times per year
- Visitation: at least one home visit per month with a report back

The biblical description of deacon ministry is found in Acts 6:1-6 and the biblical qualifications for deacons are found in 1 Timothy 3:8-13. Deacons shall act as servants of the church on a biblical basis. They help to relieve the pastor and elders from the material tasks of operating the church, engaging as needed in assisting the pastor and elders in the completion of their duties. Deacons conduct outreach into the community through their work, home & hospital visitations, and caring for the sick and needy. They assist in the operation of worship services, the collection, counting and securing of offerings and the administrations of the Lord's Supper.
