

Business Meeting MINUTES

November 3, 2024



CALL TO ORDER: by Jody Coon, Lead Pastor at 11:18am

PRAYER: by Pastor Jody Coon

ELECTORAL QUALIFICATIONS: read by Shellie Barnes from the Bylaws, Article III, Section 1 a-d. Tellers Mark Pattullo, Paul Ciske, Dave Klimmek, Kathy Cox, Chad Marble, and Terry Gillette verified that we had seventy-five (75) qualified voters present. Twenty-six - (26) voters were needed (20% of 130 avg.) for a Quorum.

IDENTIFICATION OF ELIGIBLE VOTERS: Standing count - 75 counted.

DETERMINATION OF QUORUM: seventy-five (75) counted. Quorum achieved.

APPROVAL OF ABSENTEE BALLOTS: Absentee ballots: Diane Maier, Barb Bills, Darren Rhoads, Carla Rhoads, and Deb Pattullo were approved as submitted by Election Committee Chair.

MINUTES: November 5, 2023, Annual Meeting presented in the Annual Report to the congregation. Minutes approved with one revision of the adjournment time changed from pm to am.

FINANCIAL REPORT: for 2024 dated January-September 2024. Record as printed.

CHURCH BOARD, PASTOR AND TEAM REPORTS: presented by Pastor Jody. A synopsis was given for each of our ministry teams. Pastor Jody encouraged the congregation to read the Annual Report to be informed on what is happening in our church and to become involved. No questions were asked. Accept as printed.

PRESENTATION of Proposed BUDGET FOR 2025: A.J. Yoder, the board treasurer, explained the dollar amount or the entire 2025 budget was up approximately 3% from 2024. Given the current state of the economy, a 3% increase is encouraging. A.J. explained that the General Fund currently is down \$7,100 from the revenue taken in versus the expenses paid out in 2024. A.J. closed with 2 Corinthians 9:6-7 "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

PRESENTATION OF PROPOSED BALLOT: The proposed candidates for Church Board of Directors and the Election Committee were read aloud by Shellie Barnes.

ELECTION VOTE: Ballots handed out by the Tellers.

70 - Yes 3 - No 9 - Abstain



Our first 8wk course had 19 registered children, followed by 28 children in the second 8wk course. The gifting of a bow was presented to one child per course for attendance, workbook, and memorization. 2026 Bible and Bow will begin on January 3rd and will be a 12 wk course with a brand-new curriculum that includes Christ centered devotionals and corresponding questions.

KINGDOM MOVERS Kingdom Movers Ministry, led by Julie Bishop gave prime opportunity to not only train a child to dance, but to do so in the spirit of holiness, purity, and humility, with Christ being the center of its teaching. Weekly classes began with prayer and scripture that focused primarily on adoration towards the Lord. Seven children and their the worship dance ministry, presented the dance in the Family Life Center on a Sunday morning for the entire congregation.

went outside to the archery range to host 33 children who were registered for our VBS classes, which were held August 5th, 6th, and 7th. The children were exposed to the art of shooting a bow by many skillful instructors, and in addition to archery there were a variety of games designed to work on their ability to take aim at a target. The VBS biblical teachings were based on Christ and were themed "The aim of love",
"Aiming to please", and "The aim for our life". Each morning, we all began the day with 2-3 songs of praise to the Lord through the accompaniment of an acoustic guitar. Drinks & snacks were supplied the first 2 days with a BBQ taking place on the final day. Twenty volunteers made this all happen, and we are so very thankful for the servitude that was displayed.

The Benevolence Ministry continues to meet the needs of Oscoda County residents though several outreach initiatives.

CHRISTMAS JOY project partnered with Michigan Department of Health and Human Services to provide gifts for several Oscoda County families in 2024. The goal was met thanks to your generosity, with Wendy Fuhr spearheading the program.

Our **COAT CLOSET** (Formally know as "Coats for Kids) is undergoing a renovation and relocation to a more accessible area in the church. When completed, it will offer participants a more comfortable, welcoming, and functional atmosphere. The larger room will facilitate origination and distribution of coats, boots, snow pants, hats and gloves. -Currently seeking help with this ministry.

COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY continues to serve up to 60 households monthly. Participants are offered a fresh meal at each distribution as well. Regular donations of food and money continue to keep the pantry filled. Many volunteers have stepped up to help.

The **FOOD BANK OF EASTERN MICHIGAN** (Senior Commodities Food Drop) was added to our Benevolence list this year to provide a drop location & distribution volunteers. This program provides pre-packaged food boxes delivered here by semi truck and serve as many as 172 seniors every month.

Our continued partnership with **Love IMC** helps neighbors in Oscoda County meet financial needs.

We work closely with and support **His Love Family Resources** Crisis Pregnancy & Family Center AND **Lydia's Gate** Women's Homeless Shelter.

Thank you to all of the co-laborers in Christ that make this Ministry Team a beautiful representation of God's unconditional love.




Tri Point Church of God Appearance REPORT






