Business Meeting MINUTES November 5, 2023



Call to Order: by Sam Gingerich, Board Chairperson at 11:25am

Prayer: by Pastor Jody Coon

Electoral Qualifications: read by Shellie Barnes from the Bylaws, Article III, Section 1 a-d. Tellers Mark Pattullo, Paul Ciske, and Dave Klimmek verified that we had seventy-five (75) qualified voters present. Twenty - (20)voters were needed (20% of 100 avg.) to achieve a Quorum according to the Bylaws.

The past year has been an exciting time for the life of our church. A synopsis was given for each of our ministry teams. Pastor Jody encouraged the congregation to read the Annual Report to be informed on what is happening in our church and to become involved. No questions were asked. Accepted as printed.

Presentation of Proposed Budget: A.J. Yoder, the board treasurer, explained the dollar amount for the entire 2024 budget was an educated guess based on the dollar amounts spent through August 2023. A.J. confirmed with James Schick that the \$143,519.54 on page 17 of the Annual Report is the dollar amount generated for the General Fund through August of 2023. He also explained that many areas have gone up approximately eight percent and encouraged the congregation to give to the General Fund. Election Vote: Ballots handed out by the Tellers.




Thus the saying 'One sows and another reaps' is true.
