What is human trafficking?

Human trafficking refers to the use of force, fraud, or coercion to extract labor or services from an individual against their will. It is a violation of fundamental human rights that affects an estimated 27 million people globally. Contrary to common belief, trafficking does not require movement across borders, and it occurs in communities throughout the US, including right here in Tuscaloosa.

Common Myths

Myth: Trafficking victims are kidnapped by strangers and physically restrained.

The reality is that most victims are recruited through deception, manipulation, and false promises.

Myth: Trafficking primarily involves young females.

The reality is that human trafficking victims span all genders, ages, races, and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Myth: Victims will immediately seek help when offered.

The reality is that many victims are groomed to believe their situation is normal, feel ashamed, fear their traffickers, distrust law enforcement, or lack documentation and resources to leave.

Myth: Traffickers are foreign organized crime syndicates

The reality is that traffickers include individuals, family operations, small businesses, and loose criminal networks.

Myth: Rescue operations end the story of exploitation for trafficking survivors.

The reality is that survivors face long-term challenges, including trauma, debt accrued during trafficking, difficulties accessing employment and housing, and complex paths to stability. Recovery requires comprehensive support services, not just rescue.

How you can get involved:

There are two organizations here in Alabama that are dedicated to the fight against human trafficking:

The WellHouse provides emergency, short-term, and long-term care programs for restoration to female victims of human trafficking who have been sexually exploited

The West Alabama Human Trafficking Task Force conducts training and operations focused on educating citizens in Tuscaloosa County regarding human trafficking and reducing the prevalence of trafficking in the county and nearby areas.

Georgia

Clarkston, a refugee resettlement city outside of Atlanta, is home to people from 92 unreached people groups representing 60 different countries and over 100 languages. It is known as the most ethnically diverse square mile in the US. The Lord has brought people from the ends of the earth to only 3 hours from Tuscaloosa. Valley View has an opportunity to extend hospitality to the sojourner, care for the widow and orphan, and preach the good news of Jesus Christ to those who have never heard.

In Kristopher Woods, a 193-unit apartment complex in Clarkston, there are people from all over the world. People from Afghanistan, Central African Republic, Chad, Congo, Pakistan, Rwanda, Somalia, South Africa, Sudan, Tanzania, Thailand, and other countries. You can make a difference. You can have an effect upon lostness among some of the world's unreached people groups within 3 hours of Tuscaloosa.

We need people of all ages who can help in the areas of Bible stories, music, crafts, recreation, and snacks. If you fit into one or more of these areas and are interested in being part of a ministry weekend or week to impact lostness at Kristopher Woods, we'd love to have you join us!

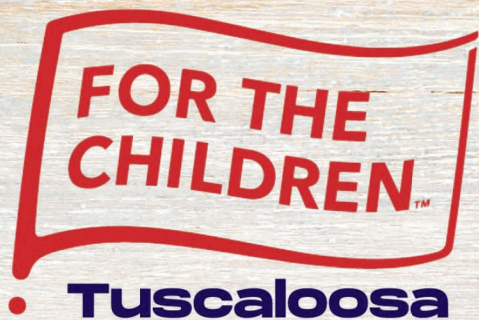

It begins with you! You give yourself first to God (2 Cor. 8:5). Next, out of gratitude and obedience to God for what He has done for you, you commit to give back to Him, through your church, a portion of what He provides. This is commonly called a tithe and represents ten percent of your income (Lev. 27:30, Mal. 3:10).

Your church decides the next step. Every year Valley View prayerfully decides how much of its undesignated gifts will be committed to reaching people in your state and around the world through The Cooperative Program. This amount is then forwarded to the Alabama Baptist State Board of Missions.

Messengers at the Alabama Baptist State Convention Annual Meeting from Valley View and other churches across Alabama decide what percentage of Cooperative Program gifts contributed by local congregations is forwarded to the SBC for North American and international missions and ministries. Alabama sends 50%.

Messengers at the Southern Baptist Convention Annual Meeting from across the country decide how the gifts received from the states will be distributed among SBC entities. These gifts are used by SBC entities to send and support missionaries, train pastors and other ministry leaders; provide relief for retired ministers and widows; and address social, moral and ethical concerns relating to our faith and families.

PRAYER

You may be wondering "How can I participate more in reaching/affecting lostness?" You may not be able to go around the world or across the street to tell someone about Jesus, but everyone can pray.

Prayer is the #1 strategy to affect lostness. Pray strategically for Unreached People Groups (UPGs) by utilizing the monthly **PrayerPoints Prayer Guide** and the annual **Loving The Lost Through Prayer Guide**. Get your copy either in your Sunday morning Bible Study class or at Missions Corner.

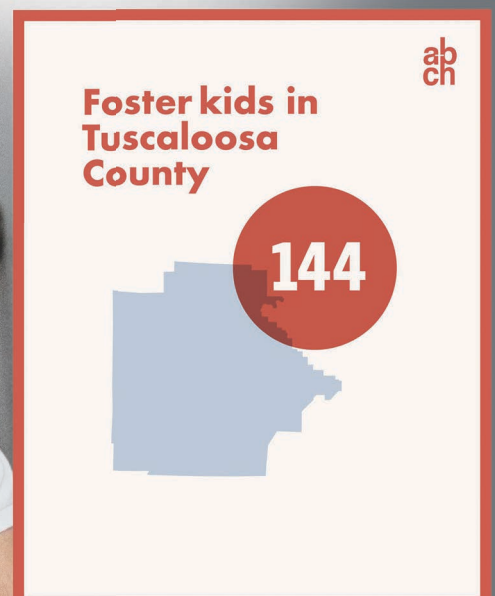

ESL CLASSES

for International Students

The Tuscaloosa County Baptist Association international ministry, English as a Second Language, meets weekly at various churches in Tuscaloosa during the fall and spring semesters of the University of Alabama school year. Those taking the course come from the countries of China, Nepal, Bangladesh, Iran, Egypt, Yemen, Cameroon, Germany, Venezuela, Brazil, Colombia, Honduras, Mexico, and others.

There are teachers, workers, and language helpers from local churches. These workers range in age from college students to senior adults. Area churches provide materials, meals, and encouragement. Training and equipping are provided for each of the teachers who teach English.

Each week the volunteer workers share English grammar, pronunciation, idioms, stories, culture, songs, and traditions. A Bible story is told during the group time. These stories begin with creation and will continue throughout the Bible to the crucifixion and resurrection of Christ and to the early church in Acts. It is their desire that throughout the year the students see and experience the love of God in Christ and hear the gospel.

GOALS

- To point people to Jesus, as the only Savior and Lord
- To teach English and an understanding of American culture
- To train American college students, especially those interested in going to the nations, to teach English in an international setting

UNTIL ALL HEAR HIS NAME

It was a 40-hour journey by car and bus, then a 50-mile hike just to find the one unengaged, unreached people group they were looking for. John's team climbed a mountain expecting to find the village and were disappointed to discover the people had moved on.

But that's not the end of the story. God had a divine appointment waiting, and you helped make it happen.

On their descent, they encountered an elderly woman from a different unreached group.

Walking down the narrow path with the woman, they shared the gospel and explained Jesus Christ is the only way to heaven. The woman loudly questioned the bold claim.

She yelled, "If what you are telling me is true, then why has nobody told me of these things before now?" Then she turned and stormed away.

John's heart broke. How will they know Jesus loves them if they've never heard the gospel?

You are helping more people groups hear the good news for the first time through your faithful giving. **Your generosity empowers Missionary Explorers like John and his team to take the gospel to the 3,072 people groups among whom there is no Christian witness.**

As of 2024, 33 Missionary Explorers were sent to 214 people groups, most of whom heard the good news for the first time.

Your missionaries serve in places hostile to the gospel. They use pathways like businesses and healthcare to do ministry among unreached people groups where it's seemingly impossible.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU JOIN A GLOBAL NEXTGEN TEAM?

One thing's for sure, you won't be a tourist! You will serve alongside an IMB team and be a vital part of the missionary task. Your time might look something like this:

ENTRY

College sophomore Eric Walker hiked a trail leading through indigenous villages, gathering information on language, culture, and beliefs. His two months of work cultivated gospel access for missionaries to share with these unengaged, unreached people groups.



EVANGELISM

Margie Jones spent the last year as a barista in a coffee house. At every opportunity, she shared Jesus' love and her faith with a customer named Fah. Fah's heart and mind were moved, and she prayed to receive Christ as her Savior. Without evangelism, it's not missions.



DISCIPLESHIP

Rubi Ortega used her passion for teaching with a college Bible study in Paris. For an entire semester, Rubi helped the students, both new and strong believers, dig deep into the Bible and apply it to their own lives. Their faith, as well as Rubi's, grew. Discipleship is at the heart of the Great Commission and critical for a healthy church.



HEALTHY CHURCH FORMATION

In just three weeks Melvin Le's team helped start a church. His team partnered with a local Thai pastor who was already evangelizing in his community and discipling a small group. The team helped the local believers understand and adopt biblical characteristics of a church. Melvin couldn't stop smiling as he worshiped at their first church service.

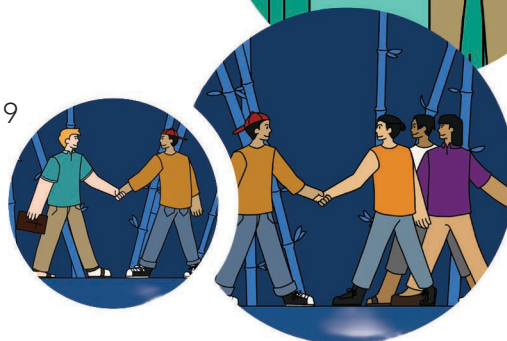


TRAINING LEADERS

The First Baptist Church youth group from Kansas flapped their arms in the air like birds to the delight of the Zambian children. Vacation Bible School was a new experience for most attending the event—children and adults. Working beside each Kansas youth was a local believer learning how to recreate VBS. Training—whether in the classroom or through experiential learning—sets up a church to reach the nations.

EXIT TO PARTNERSHIP

From the nations, to the nations—in pursuit of the Revelation 7:9 vision—Taiwanese churches have risen to the challenge of taking the gospel to places it's never been. IMB Journeyman Paul and LaTisha Brown play a vital role in equipping and working alongside them. Raising self-sustaining churches is critical.

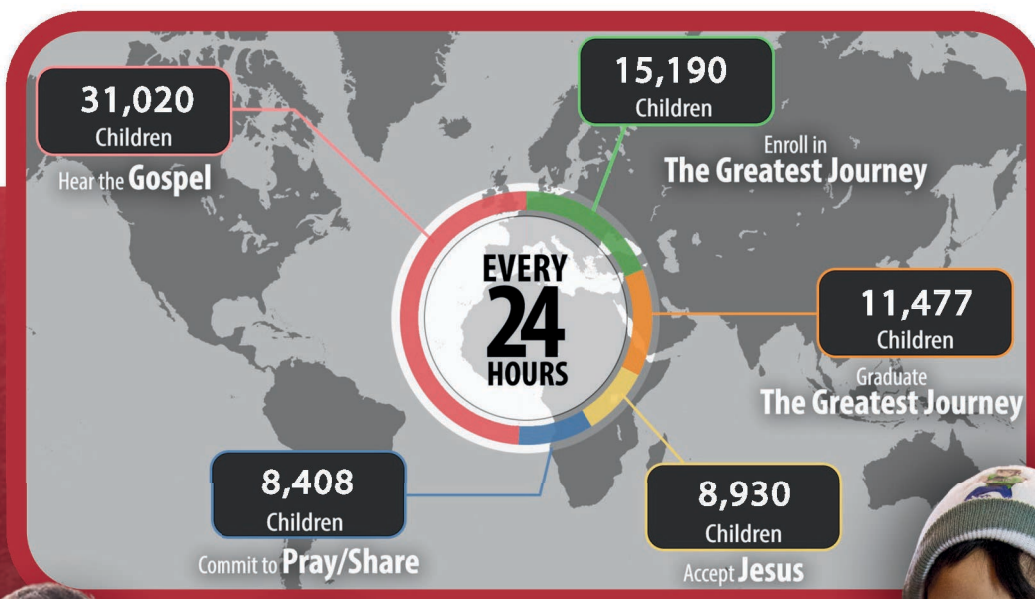

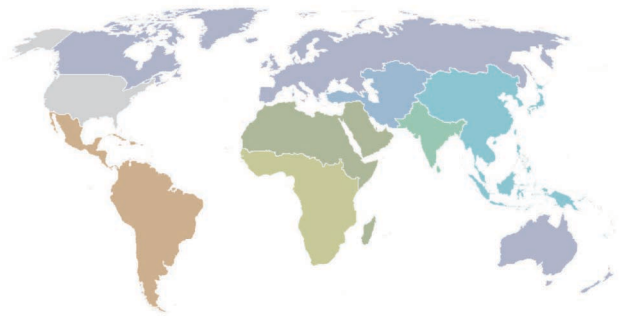
