





Reverend Zachary Hopple

Family Promise meals in September



September Mission of the Month: Ronald McDonald House in Philadelphia
The mission of the RMH is to support families of seriously ill children by creating a community of comfort and hope. A RMH program helps reduce stress and financial burden for families when they must travel far from home to access medical care for their child. Families don't have to worry about where to stay. At a RMH, families can be together, enjoy home-cooked meals, and receive compassionate hospitality and support - all near the child's hospital. Houses are built on the simple idea that nothing else should matter when a family is focused on the health of their child. Stays in the house range from one night to more than a year. Each house is run by a group of full-time paid employees, assisted by a large staff of volunteers. Many of the houses offer additional resources, including accredited education programs, recreational activities, children's art therapy and music programs, and gardens so families can grow vegetables and herbs like they do at home.

The Philadelphia RMH was the first of the Ronald McDonald Charities. Early in 1974, two Pediatric Oncologists at CHOP saw families spending night after night in the hospital while their children received medical care, and they recognized the need for a house where families could stay. At the same time, the Philadelphia Eagles were fundraising in support of a player's daughter who was battling leukemia. The Eagles' manager met with the two oncologists and committed to supporting their dream for a house. He approached their advertiser, McDonald's, for support and they agreed to fund the house through "Shamrock Shake" sales. The house opened in October 1974. The RMH is now worldwide, with over 387 houses in 62 countries. The majority of programming funds comes from individuals, organizations, and businesses.

The Eckhart family's grandson/great-grandson, Charlie, is currently being treated at CHOP. He and his parents, Tim and Emma, are now residing in the Philadelphia RMH. Tim sent a brief paragraph about their stay: "The RMH is a

great transitional place for us on Charlie's journey to recovery. We need to be within an hour of the hospital, in case of fever or infection, so we can't go home quite yet. The RMH provides us a place to stay that's close to the hospital. We can walk back and forth, but they also provide frequent shuttles to the hospital and back. They also provide dinner every day and breakfast a couple of times a week, which is one less thing to worry about. They offer many activities for both caregivers and children, like trips to the zoo and mindfulness sessions, but because of Charlie's situation, we haven't been able to take advantage of them. I particularly enjoy the gardens on the outside terrace that have lots of flowers, pears, and tomatoes. This is all provided for free. They only ask for a suggested donation when we eventually check out."

<u>Grief Support: Loss of a Spouse & GriefShare begin soon</u> Our church offers support for those who are grieving.


<u>Wednesday, September 17th</u>: 1:30 to 3:30 PM <u>Loss of a Spouse</u>, a one-time program. No charge.


