

# Reverend Zachary Hopple

October - a month here in Pennsylvania that is full of color as the leaves change and people put out pumpkins and gourds for decorations. The air is crisp in the morning and at night, yet somewhat warm during the day. October marks a time of transition where we see the beauty of fall and





his letters with his eloquent greetings. For example, in 2 Corinthians he writes, "Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God." (2 Cor 1:2-4).

As you may already know from some of my sermons, I love looking at definitions of words. So let's look at the definition of the word "comfort." According to Merriam-Webster as a verb "to comfort" is to give strength or to give hope, to ease grief or trouble. As a noun, "comfort" is support, consolation in times of trouble or a feeling of relief or encouragement.

In this brief introduction to his letter, Paul reminds us that the Lord is the God of compassion and comfort and that God comforts all of us in our troubles. We can then comfort others with the comfort we have received. It is a wonderful message of encouragement, but also a message of expectation - that we are expected to comfort one another.

As a church we are very willing to offer this comfort to one another. But sometimes we don't always know when to offer that assistance and support. Sometimes we can be somewhat private and not want to share what is going on in our lives. Other times, we may feel no one will understand what we are going through so we don't bother to share. But no one will know what we are going through if we do not allow them to know.

I once had a parishioner who was in the hospital for a few days in the middle of the week. Their stay in the hospital was unexpected and I had seen them two days before. When they returned home, they called me to tell me they were upset because I never visited them in the hospital. I asked them if they had called to tell me they were in the hospital and they said no. I asked them if they asked their family to notify me that they were in the hospital and they said no. I kindly asked the person to consider how I would have known they were in the hospital if neither of those communications had occurred in order to alert me. They were unsure and eventually understood, but this conversation remains with me all these years later.

We need to open up and share with one another so that we can be supported and encouraged. We need to let each other know when we are hurting or are in pain or grieving. On the flip side, we also need to reach out to offer that support and encouragement even when we may not know if it is needed. I try to remind people all the time that I am here whenever someone needs to talk. It is an open invitation.

So I want to encourage you this month to reach out to the people around you, those you see on a regular basis, and those who may not have seen for a few weeks. Check in on one another. Ask how someone is doing. See how you can offer words of encouragement and support because we all need comfort from time to time and God has given us love and comfort enough to share.

# October Mission of the Month: CUMC Loan Fund

Have you ever been in a situation like me where you were out to lunch with a friend and you forgot your wallet? Or maybe the restaurant didn't take credit cards and you had no cash on you? In order to pay the bill, you needed to borrow a few dollars from your friend. How about a time you needed tires for your car or a new piece of furniture and had to finance the payments because you could not afford to pay for them all at once? These types of things happen to people all the time.



But for some, financial insecurity is much more severe than borrowing a few dollars from a friend or opening a new credit card to get special financing to help pay for something. In some cases, having to pay back those few dollars could break the bank and they may never qualify for that new credit card or for the special financing. For others, every penny of their income goes to food or utilities and there is nothing left over if something unexpected comes up. These situations happen more than we realize and many times, people are uncertain about where to turn when they do. Can we as a church help in tough times?

The answer is YES! Christ UMC has been blessed to have two different ways that we can help people make ends meet. The first way is through the Helping Hands Fund. This is a grant given to those who may need short term assistance with minor funding for items such as utility bills, rent assistance, and other minor expenses.

The second way that our church helps those in need is through the CUMC Loan Fund, which is the focus for October's Mission of the Month. The Loan Fund offers a no interest loan to those who are associated with the church who may find it difficult to receive a loan through other means. These loans are to help cover the costs that exceed the capacity of the Helping Hands Fund and are repaid on a schedule that is agreeable to both the borrower and the church as the lender. Both the Helping Hands Fund and the Loan Fund are overseen by several people in key positions of leadership within our church. Each confidential request is carefully researched, evaluated, and voted upon before any funds are distributed.

You might be asking, why is the Loan Fund our Mission of the Month for October? During the time I have been appointed here we have had two loans that were distributed and repaid in full. However, we have had to turn others away because we did not have the funds available to meet their needs. Additionally, the cost of living has been increasing drastically and more and more people are finding it difficult to make ends meet. While we have some funds readily available, sadly they are not enough to meet the growing needs of some within our church community. In light of these changing and difficult times for some, I ask you to consider giving to support the CUMC Loan Fund as October's Mission of the Month. Thank you. –Pastor Zach


