




#### Reverend Zachary Hopple

This is the time of year that I love best. The crisp air brings about the need for a sweatshirt, but not yet a coat. The earlier sunset makes stargazing much easier (and agreeable with my bedtime). And the changing color of the trees makes the red leaves that I normally see seem not so odd as everyone who gets a taste of what I see on a regular basis.

November is often seen as a time of thanksgiving. A time where we pause to reflect on what we have and what we've been given. God has blessed each





While we give thanks for what we have, many people have a void in their lives. They cannot truly be thankful because they realize something is missing. There is something else that they need and they cannot put their finger on it. They cannot figure it out. And so they strive for more and more and are not content with what they find and what they accomplish. They never seem to be truly happy and throw themselves into the pursuit of gaining more.



November 6<sup>th</sup>, 2025, 6:30 PM

Once a month, our group of volunteers come together to cook a meal for Manna on Main Street, a soup kitchen/food pantry located in Lansdale. We spend about 1-1.5 hours prepping meals that feed approximately 90 people. Meal prep tasks include washing and chopping vegetables or fruit, shredding chicken, cooking pasta, and assembling the meal. Folks of all ages are invited to help the group prepare the meal, so feel free to bring a friend or family members to help. This is a great way for youth to earn volunteer hours. Children are welcome, but must be supervised and assisted. The cooking typically gets underway the first Thursday of every month in Room 110 (Kitchen) at 6:30 PM. November Mission of the Month: Heifer International

The Mission of the Month for November is Heifer International. Heifer International is working to end hunger and poverty while caring for the Earth. They gift livestock, training, tools, and resources to families in need. Animals give families things to eat, like milk, eggs, and honey. Training helps families learn how to keep their animals healthy. Families also learn how to create businesses to sell the extra products from their animals. The goal is to give families hope, a source of income, and a brighter future. Since 2012, Heifer has partnered with farmers across 4 continents and 19 countries, helping 4 million households.

Heifer has a philosophy called "Passing On the Gift." Families that receive a lifesaving animal from Heifer will give the first female offspring to another community member, and in addition will pass on everything they learn from Heifer about caring for it. On average, a gift made to a family in need is passed down nine more times!

During the month of November, all donations for Mission of the Month will be used to purchase a variety of animals, which could include heifers, water buffalo, sheep, goats, ducks, or pigs.

Our Children and Youth Sunday School classes will participate as well, by collecting funds for the "buy one get two chicks and bees" promotion. A purchase of a honeybee and chicks bundle for \$50 will provide two families with both chickens and bees so they can use and sell the honey and eggs.


