(And yes it always seemed to rain when we went camping.) And while I was never really a fan of school (what kid is?!?), it never was as bad as my mind thought it would be as I contemplated it on those warm August days.

This life gives us many opportunities for different experiences. Some of those experiences are good - some not so much. Some we make for ourselves - others are thrust upon us by our circumstances. But when we focus too much on what may or may not come we often lose sight of what is right in front of us, and we miss the perfect opportunity to take advantage of the moment.

In Galatians 6, Paul encourages us to take advantage of every opportunity to do something good. He says, "let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers" (Gal 6:9-10). If we are too focused on the worry of what might come, we will miss out on what is here. We will be oblivious to the needs of those around us. We will overlook the signs of people needing help. We will fail to enjoy what God has given us right here and now.

And so as we start to make our way through the end of the summer, let us remember to enjoy what is here and now instead of worrying about what may come. Let us look for opportunities to do good and support one another. Let us take the time to encourage people to live into their faith as best as they can. Let us observe the world around us and celebrate what God has done while helping to improve upon the things we may have broken. And may God bless us all as we strive to live into God's will for us.

Children are welcome, but must be supervised and assisted. The cooking typically gets underway the first Thursday of every month in Room 110 (Kitchen) at 6:30 PM.

- Attending Graduate school to become a Bible translation facilitator to provide Scripturebased audiovisual media to their community in their local language
- Hosting Scripture Discovery Groups to teach Bible stories
- Providing computer school training to raise both the educational and economic level of their community




