 - Brian Sherman repaired the connection for the nativity lights in December. Then during the General Cleaning, he & Corbjin fixed the slow draining sink in Room 9 – it involved renting a snake to get under the patio concrete. He also shut off the water fountain just outside the kitchen door – people off the street have been using it to wash up, and letting their dogs drink from it, so we didn't want anyone drinking from it.

 - I bought new wheels for the coffee cart and was going to install them until I realized the cart was bigger than I am. Bert Rapp installed them, with some help from Troy.
 - And then Scott McComas jumped in, and has been helping out with electricity! He replaced the outlet where we plug in the coffee, which is why we've actually had hot coffee that past few weeks! He also replaced the switch for the alcove lights in the church.
- · We have changed out our frayed American flag for a new one
- As you can see, we've finally made some progress with the playground! It took a lot of people and a lot of effort to get to this point, but we finally have permits and the installation has started.

The rain, of course, has slowed down the installation a bit, but it's happening. Thank you to John Chaudier for finishing the permit process and bringing it home.

- The concrete water meter enclosure in the sidewalk on the left of the driveway on Lark Street was crumbling, and it has been repaired by the city. It was nice to have a repair that wasn't actually our responsibility!
- General Cleaning on Feb 23 went great we had 22 volunteers.
 People volunteered for particular areas or asked to be assigned, so it all went quite smoothly. Thank you to all who helped!
