The 1960 Hope Center has been created to offer basic human services to the homeless men and women in our area.

More than 665 men and women have been registered at the Hope Center since we opened our doors on August 29, 2016.

More than 100 formerly homeless guests of the Hope Center are no longer on the street. Some have been reconciled with family; others are working and have shelter.

More than 30 organizations have provided volunteers and/or financial support to the Hope Center.

The 1960 Hope Center offers the following services:

- 180 outfits of clothing
- 120 showers
- 800 hot lunches
- 100 volunteers
- 1500 volunteer hours
