One of my favourite Chapters in the Bible is 2 Corinthians 4. I love it because it captures the heart for reaching out, it captures the struggles of the faith, and it captures the reason we press on. Can I encourage you to read it later for encouragement but what I would love to do here is write a similar encouragement from my point of view, and with a reminder of what we have been looking at the last few weeks in Church.

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ, it is so remarkable that we can address each other that way. Not just friends but a body, a family held together by Christ. It never ceases to amaze me that God would choose a motley crew like us to call his spotless bride and to reveal such a beautiful gospel. What have we done to deserve God opening our eyes to His truth? Nothing. We are so undeserving. Yet in His divine love God has shone light into our dark lives and revealed Himself through the Holy Spirit and the Scriptures.

Sometimes it feels like it is too much of an honour for someone like me. Sometimes I just can't understand why others haven't grasped this fundamental truth of life. Yet Gods word is there for all, and is a ready open door to freedom for anyone who calls on the Lord in repentance. All must die because of the separation from God, but to those who have Christ dwelling within, resurrection stands waiting, new life is our future. I've heard it once said if you truly grasp what a gift God has given you wouldn't stop telling others, and if you are quiet on such a wonderful reward, you must truly hate everyone you fail to tell. We've been commanded to tell everyone go and make disciples of all nations. For this is the purpose of Christ saving us, that we might bring honour and glory to Him. His glory is His death and resurrection, for through that death and resurrection He calls people to life. His glory is displayed through this simple good news. So, as His people we show forth this truth as plain as we can and to anyone we can. We do this for His glory and honour until the day He returns.

Therefore remember, you are special. You are one of God's elect. Do not lose heart, yes I know it is hard, this body is weak and the hours are few. But do this, fix your eyes on Christ, fill up on His light, so that you may overflow with His presence as a testimony of Him to all people. For the rewards of heaven are infinite and the trials of this life are short. God's glory is apparent, and His hope is sure. Press on till the end hold firm to the faith and share it without restraint.
