People And blessed be his kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.


COLLECT FOR PURITY


The Celebrant may say

THE SERMON

THE CREED

All stand.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation

he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit

he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again

in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Leader: For all ministries in this program year—formation, outreach, music, hospitality, pastoral care, and more—Breathe new life into our efforts, and help us do all things in your name.

People: Jesus, be the center of all we do.

Leader: For the saints who have gone before us, especially those who formed us in faith: May their witness inspire us to live boldly for your kingdom.

People: We thank you for their lives and their love.

Celebrant: Gracious God, As we step into this new season together, renew our vision, deepen our faith, and strengthen our community. Make us not only hearers of your Word, but doers of your will.

People: Amen. Come, Holy Spirit, and make all things new.

The Great Thanksgiving

In this prayer, the lines in bold are spoken by the People.

God of all power, Source and Sustainer of the Universe, you are worthy of glory and praise.

Glory to you for ever and ever.

At your command all things came to be: shining light and enfolding dark; the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, suns,

and this fragile earth, our island home.

By your will they were created and have their being.

From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with the capacity for memory, reason, and skill. You made us the stewards of your creation. But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another.

Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.

Again and again, you called us to return.

Through prophets and sages you revealed your righteous Law. And in the fullness of time you sent your eternal Word,

born of your servant Mary,

to fulfill your Law, opening for us the way of freedom and peace.

By his blood, he reconciled us. By his wounds, we are healed.

And therefore we praise you,

joining with the heavenly chorus,

with prophets, apostles, and martyrs,

DISTRIBUTION

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the sacrament regardless of age or Christian tradition. You may take the bread alone or the bread and the wine as is your custom. If you need gluten-free bread, there is an option available. Please tell the priest if you would like the gluten-free option.

Please come forward to the altar rail to receive communion. You may kneel or stand. If you are more comfortable staying seated, please wait in your seat and the priest will bring communion to you after finishing distribution at the altar rail.

If you would like to receive a blessing, you can come forward to the altar rail and indicate to the priest that you would prefer to have a blessing.

POST-COMMUNION PRAYER

After Communion, the Celebrant says

Let us pray.

Eternal God, heavenly Father, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood.
