



## Scotland – Reformed

1513-1542 – King James V (Henry VIII's nephew), reigns in Scotland

[1517 – 95 Theses posted in Wittenberg]

1528 – Patrick Hamilton, a Lutheran, executed

1539 – David Beaton becomes Archbishop of St. Andrews & is made Cardinal

1542 – Mary Stuart (Mary I, Queen of Scots) ascends the throne when she is six days old.

1544 – Protestant martyrdoms, including Helen Stark

1543 – 1551 – The “Rough Wooing” of Scotland -- a series of invasions by England

1546 – George Wishart burned at the stake on the order of Cardinal Beaton

-- Cardinal Beaton assassinated at St. Andrews Castle

-- Knox and others besieged in St. Andrews Castle

1548 – Knox captured and sent to the galleys

1554 – Mary of Guise becomes Regent of Scotland

[1558, Mary Tudor, Mary 1 of England aka “Bloody Mary,” dies]

1559 – John Knox returns permanently to Scotland

1560 – Scots Confession

1561 – Mary, Queen of Scots, returns to Scotland

1566 – Mary, Queen of Scots, dethroned

1567 – James VI ascends throne

1611 - King James Bible supplants the Geneva Bible
