



Counselor's Corner

In holiday seasons, memories seem more vivid, emotions more powerful, and regrets and losses felt more keenly. In the season of "togetherness and joy," I have noticed that many (maybe most) struggle with at least some feelings of emptiness, sadness, and longing. For some, childhood holiday memories were not positive.

Others feel especially alone during this time of social gatherings. For many, there is heaviness due to the loss of loved ones. Struggles with difficult relationships and with real or perceived personal failings contrast sharply with the "expected joyfulness" of the season.

Only each person knows their struggle, but scripture indicates we get to choose the things on which our mind focuses. Our mind is sometimes like a balky horse that wants to wander, but we must reign it in (II Corinthians 10:5) and force it to focus on Godly perspectives.

Paul wrote (Philippians 4:8), "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true...noble...
just...pure...lovely...are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything
praiseworthy—meditate on these things." This verse is written on a dry erase board
in my office. I often must redirect my mind away from hurts, regrets and failures...
and focus on things for which I'm grateful...a baby in the manger...shepherds being
surprised...angels praising God for His goodwill toward us...children in Christmas
plays...pecan pie!

I focus on heavenly reunions...on God's amazing grace toward me...and the reality that this life is only the "dressing room for all eternity!" I'm especially grateful that the one who came to us at Bethlehem will return to this chaotic world and set things right! Dr. Jon Garrison Psy.D.
