A WORD FROM PASTOR LAURA

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

April always brings Easter celebrations. This year, in the month of April we will celebrate the second, third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Easter. When you go to the greeting card section of the drugstore, a sign will remind you "Easter is March 31" so that you don't forget to spend your money by then. On April 1, everything Easter-related will go on sale. But in the church, our celebration continues for seven weeks. We will celebrate Easter this year through May 12, hearing the resurrection stories and proclaiming "Alleluia" each week until then.

Our Faithtime kids learn in their Godly Play lessons during the Easter season about Knowing Jesus in a New Way – the resurrected Jesus is still fully human and fully divine, but in a brand-new way. Our Gospel stories throughout the season of Easter include resurrection stories from the Gospels of John and Luke, and two of Jesus's "I am" sayings from John's Gospel. We learn more about who Jesus is, and in turn learn more about our God, by listening closely to what Jesus says and does in these passages.

The month of April brings the conclusion of our Faithtime program year. Our 5th grade students will have the opportunity to learn more about the Fruit of the Spirit as they mark the end of their Faithtime years and prepare for middle school and their Quest time. The whole congregation is welcome to join us for our final Faithtime Dinner of the year – now scheduled for Wednesday, April 17 (details on page 6).

The end of April will be the middle of the Easter season, and there is no better time than right in the middle of the season in which we celebrate new life to think about the future for which God is preparing us as a congregation.

After 168 years of ministry, what new life might be waiting for First Lutheran? We will gather on the evening of Sunday, April 28 to celebrate our proud past and prepare for a faithful future. The Mission Endowment Committee hosts this event as the kickoff to a multi-year fundraising effort, in honor of the upcoming 170th anniversary of the congregation. A gift to the Mission Endowment Fund will generate income for decades to come that can be used by the congregation to support a variety of ministry efforts. A gift to the Mission Endowment Fund is a wonderful and meaningful way to memorialize loved ones, honor those who have taught you about Jesus, and declare your trust in the future of this congregation's ministry. Alleluia! Christ is Risen! He brings new life to you, and me, and the whole church – indeed, the whole world! Spotlight On...Sunday Fellowship

Each month, we highlight an area of volunteer ministry that has "openings" for additional volunteers. This month, our focus is Sunday morning Fellowship. Those currently serving in this way share their experiences:

Shelly Kauzlarich has been working in the church kitchen for at least 25 years. She started cooking meals for Vacation Bible School and Confirmation, then was on a Faithtime Meal team, and now serves Sunday morning Fellowship every couple months.

Sam & Erin Marshall and Jenn & Tony Stoeger are more recent recruits. They have volunteered to serve on a Fellowship Team for about a year, give or take a bit.

1. Why did you decide to volunteer for this ministry? Or, why did you say "yes" when you were asked to serve?

Shelly: I love to cook and serve meals so how could I say no?! It is something I enjoy doing and makes me feel good.

Sam & Erin: Betsy Brudos asked us if we wanted to help. Since we were fairly new to the church we wanted to meet more church members. We've met so many people this way! Betsy and Dan helped teach us the ropes so it wasn't intimidating at all.

Jenn: We said yes because we enjoy fellowship. Fellowship helped us quickly get to know people when we first started going to First Lutheran.

2. What might you say to encourage someone who is considering joining the team? Shelly: Just do it! It is a fun time and you feel the love and appreciation from all you serve.

Sam & Erin: It's not a significant time commitment - only once every 4-6 weeks. Since we are typically Saturday night church attendees, it allows us to see/visit with people we don't get to normally see on Sunday mornings.

Jenn: First Lutheran is a kind place to volunteer.

3. How is your faith strengthened by your work in this ministry?

Sam & Erin: Getting to talk with your fellow church members and learning more about one another has strengthened relationships with each other.

Jenn: For me, my faith is strengthened when I serve others.

4. How do you get to participate in the work of "Sharing Christ's Love" by serving in this way?

Shelly: I see the smiles and the appreciation on all those I serve. I know I am touching them in a special way.

Sam & Erin: We get to participate in an act of service, plus help to foster additional fellowship after worship.

Jenn: One way Jesus showed love and compassion was to feed his followers which is what we do (on a much smaller scale) with Fellowship.

5. What do you like best about this work?

Shelly: Again the smiles and appreciation shown from the simple gesture I do.

Sam & Erin: Connecting with other church members. Sampling all of Jenn's yummy baked goods is also a bonus!

Jenn: I enjoy our crew and I enjoy baking.

Civic Life and Faith: A New Social Statement

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is currently in the middle of the 6-year process of developing a new Social Statement. Currently, the ELCA has 13 Social Statements on a wide variety of topics, including Abortion, Caring for Creation, Education, Genetics, and Race, ethnicity, and culture. They can all be accessed at www.elca.org/Resources/Faith-and-Society, or by asking Pastor Laura or a member of our congregation's Social Ministry team.

From elca.org: "ELCA social statements are teaching and policy documents that provide broad frameworks to assist us in thinking about and discussing social issues in the context of faith and life. They are meant to help communities and individuals with moral formation, discernment and thoughtful engagement with current social issues as we participate in God's work in the world. Social statements also set policy for the ELCA and guide its advocacy and work as a publicly engaged church. They result from an extensive process of participation and deliberation and are adopted by a two-thirds vote of an ELCA churchwide assembly."

The 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly authorized the development of a social statement on Church, State and Civic Participation. In December 2023, the draft Social Statement was published, and now is the draft response period. Members of ELCA communities have until September 30 to read the draft and submit feedback to the Task Force via a survey. The draft Social Statement and a link to the survey can be found at elca.org/civicsandfaith, or printed copies are available at our Resource Center.
