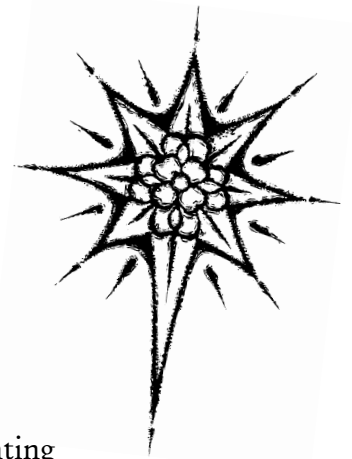

Happy New Year!

The season of Advent brings a new year in our church calendar. Our first season of the year is always a season of waiting. We wait for the Christ child to be born, but we also wait expectantly for Jesus' Second Coming.

The readings we use in Worship each weekend are the assigned readings from the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), which is a prescribed set of Bible readings for every Sunday and major festival of the church year. The readings correspond to the seasons of the church year: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and time after Pentecost. The RCL is used by Christians in many denominations in many places around the world. So, on any given weekend, the readings we hear proclaimed in Worship are the same readings that Presbyterians in Pennsylvania and Anglicans in Australia are hearing.

The RCL has a three-year cycle. We hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ from Matthew, Mark, and Luke in each respective year, with stories from the Gospel of John interspersed throughout. This year, we are beginning our journey with the Gospel of Mark.

Mark does not include any stories of Jesus' birth or childhood in his Gospel. His Gospel begins with Jesus as a fully grown man, coming to the Jordan River where John the Baptist is at work. That means our Advent readings from Mark focus primarily on Jesus' Second Coming, rather than on his birth.

The devotional provided to the congregation this year for Advent is based on the beginning of Luke's Gospel, which is good for those of us who long to hear the stories preparing for Jesus' birth at this time each year. "*How Does a Weary World Rejoice?*" is a collection of devotional essays, poems, hymns, and artwork based on the first two chapters of Luke's Gospel.

These devotional resources are created by the team at A Sanctified Art. Each week has a focus theme: We acknowledge our weariness; we find joy in connection; we allow ourselves to be amazed; and we sing stories of hope. The devotional then continues through the season of Christmas and into Epiphany, concluding with the Baptism of our Lord.

Full-color print copies of the devotional will be available at the Resource Center after December 1. A link to an e-reader version will also be emailed to the congregation with the announcements on December 1. We will use some worship resources from A Sanctified Art to accompany the season's devotional theme, including the Prayers of the People (also called the Prayers of Intercession). I will seek input each week on our church Facebook page, as these prayers are being prepared for weekend worship.

The season of Advent will include a special worship opportunity, "*Angels We Have Heard*" on Sunday, December 17, featuring special music from many of the musicians of our congregation. The Advent season culminates on the morning of December 24, as we present The ABC's of Christmas, a family-friendly worship opportunity for all ages.

I pray that each of you is blessed in this new church year, as we listen closely to hear the story again.

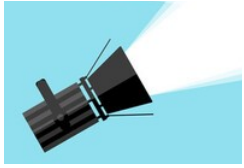

Spotlight On...Community Christmas Dinner

Each month, we highlight an area of volunteer ministry that has “openings” for additional volunteers. This month is the Community Christmas Dinner. Volunteers share their experiences:

Margi Ficken and her family have been volunteering with the Community Christmas Dinner for over 10 years. They have helped with food preparation, serving, and meal delivery.

Julie Kunkel and her husband Jeff have been volunteering since 2010.

1. Why did you decide to volunteer for this ministry? Or, why did you say “yes” when you were asked to serve?

Margi: The ministry of providing food to others or the sharing of a meal together has been a passion of mine since I was young. I was blessed to have parents who modeled service and hospitality so I served at many food banks or meal sites over the years. I volunteered to help with the Community Christmas Dinner because I love to help with any event where food and fellowship are shared. I have found great joy by seeing people come together to share in a meal on Christmas Day or have it delivered to their home.

Julie: Our families celebrate Christmas on Christmas Eve. Jeff wanted to help other people that either didn’t have a place to go or families to be with on Christmas. It was an opportunity to share some Christmas joy with others.

2. How is your faith strengthened by your work in this ministry?

Margi: My faith is strengthened by being God’s vessel to serve those who are joining together in a meal. I have enjoyed watching the fellowship, conversation, and laughter during the meal or when bringing the meal to their home. I know that God is always in the midst which strengthens my faith.

Julie: Our faith has certainly grown through this ministry. Giving of ourselves, serving others, being there for someone isn’t hard to do. Jeff is also committed to the funeral ministry and I help when I can. This ministry and the funeral ministry are absolutely amazing. I think we have both become a little more patient and more understanding regarding certain situations.

3. What might you say to encourage someone who is considering joining the team?

Margi: Volunteering for this meal is rewarding and meaningful and help is always appreciated.

Julie: It is very fulfilling and time well spent. Whether you are washing dishes, serving food, or picking up dishes and engaging in conversations, it is all time well spent. It is just one big family gathering. The kitchen is crazy. It can all be a little hectic at times, but a good hectic. Everyone has a “job” to do, and we all work together to make this an enjoyable day for everyone.

4. How do you get to participate in the work of “*Sharing Christ’s Love*” by serving in this way?

Margi: Sharing Christ’s love is the focus of this ministry, and it is heartwarming to see the gratitude on people’s faces when a meal is delivered to their door or shared in our Fellowship Room.

Julie: Strangers, people of our congregation, people who come regularly all come for the same reason: to share a meal, to share in conversations, to be welcomed. We are all gathered to give them a little grace, comfort, friendly conversation and a great meal - sharing all our gifts.

5. What do you like best about this work?

Margi: What I like best is working together with members of our church to provide a place for many to experience the birth of Christ through a meal and Christian community.

Julie: It’s just a wonderful day! It’s busy, it’s fun. Some people have been coming year after year. It’s nice to see them and they enjoy coming. They appreciate the Christmas Dinner and that’s how they spend their day, just like Jeff and I do.

Our QUEST: To Be Good Stewards & Cheerful Givers

While reading scripture to learn what God says about our monthly themes, the 6th graders in QUEST are finding that Bible language can be “weird” and “confusing.” To answer our QUESTions about what the words mean, we study various versions and translations of our passages.

In November, we also turned to the dictionary to understand what STEWARDSHIP means. Did you know that a *steward* is someone who *supervises, manages, or takes care* of something? That’s what God asks us to do: to take care of God’s creation and all of our resources and gifts.

Time, for example, is a precious resource. The students colored a time wheel to see how they use each hour of the day. As 6th graders, much of their schedule is

set by grown-ups (*the adult stewards of these young lives!*) who insist that the kids sleep and go to school. Still, the students found ways to spend time praying and helping others.

We also talked about stewarding money. To practice being “cheerful givers,” the students learned about 10 global and local charities, then received a stack of Monopoly money to allocate as they saw fit. These young people have big hearts; most asked if they could take a loan from the fake bank so they could do even more good!

Though the calendar year is drawing to an end, the church year is about to begin anew with Advent. So, when QUEST resumes on November 29, we’ll shift our focus to BEGINNINGS. The students will be making plans to *start something new*. Will you join us?
