# A Word From Pastor Matt

# Love is in the Air

Being a somewhat recently married man (12 years), and since it's February, I think it is fitting to examine and investigate this upcoming saint's day of St. Valentine. St. Valentine, according to Wikipedia (a reliable source), was not just one person in the life of the church, but maybe several. The origin of Valentine, and how many Valentines there were, remains somewhat a mystery. Probably the best evidence of whom Valentine was comes from historians who hold that St. Valentine was a temple priest jailed for defiance during the reign of Claudius and eventually was beaten and executed around February 14, 296 for trying to convert the Emperor and his court to Christianity. In 496, two hundred years later, Pope Gelasius marked February 14<sup>th</sup> as a celebration in honor of his martyrdom. Whoever Valentine was, he was truly a bold witness to the faith.

What makes St. Valentine the patron of love comes from legend of him marrying young Christians when Christianity was still viewed in the Roman world as rebellious to the Roman cult of the emperor. Is St. Valentine's Day about romantic love? Well, not really. Even though legend has it that St. Valentine married young Christians, and Valentine's Day is a day in which love between couples is celebrated, we forget that he stood up for his faith and love in Christ Jesus. This was in defiance to an oppressive powerful force that sought to undermine a message of hope, redemption, and love. We forget that love calls and invites us to sometimes do things which might lead us into danger. Valentine, like so many others, gave his life up for the love he came to know in Jesus Christ. A love that he shared with others who were seeking to be bound in love.

As Valentine's Day comes around in the middle of this month remind yourself of the witness of St. Valentine who stood up for love in a time that was difficult to do so. Valentine stood up for the love that he came to know in Christ Jesus, which is a love that is patient; and kind; which is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends (1 Corinthians 13).

And as you celebrate the love you share with your loved ones, always know that you are so very loved by the One who has brought us all into life, redeemed and forgiven us for all time, and promises to be with us till the end of time inviting us to stand up for love in Jesus' name.
