VOICES ON THE MOUNTAIN

A WORD FROM PASTOR MATT

On the last Sunday before Lent we always celebrate the Transfiguration of Jesus Christ where Jesus' appearance was changed. Before Jesus goes down the mountain in the valley of Lent and his journey toward the cross, we get to hear again the voice that led us all here. We again hear God's voice on the mountain.

And accompanying God's voice were a bunch of other voices. There were the voices that came from Moses and Elijah who graced Jesus and the disciples with their presence. Moses' voice long ago led the people from bondage to slavery to the freedom of the promised land. Moses' voice taught them the commandments and was present through the wilderness. Elijah's voice long ago helped to direct God's people away from idolatry. The hearing again of Elijah's voice would signal the coming of the Messiah.

These voices were pillars within the faith. The voice of the teacher and the voice of the prophet. Both voices are always needed, for the faith to be passed down from generation to generation, but in the mix of those two voices there was a third voice. The third voice was Jesus. Jesus' words and voice had led the disciples up this mountain. It was the voice that welcomed them and forgave them and others. It was the voice that told them to get up and go and to not be afraid. It was the same voice that had healed others and would later cry from the cross. It was a voice of love. These three voices on that mountain reigned supreme.

But then, out of nowhere, Peter adds his voice to the mix, thinking that something needed to be said, not knowing that in holy moments, really nothing needs to be said. Peter says, "'Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say, for they were terrified." (Mark 9:5-6) Peter's fear led him to say something and do something, rather than just watching, waiting, listening, and enjoying this mountaintop holy experience, which is sometimes all that is needed.

Peter's insistence to say or do something, led God to say and do something to help Peter to listen better. For it seems that God's still and silent voice is only heard when we set time apart to listen, not when we talk or do. But we always need to say something or do something, so God adds God's voice to the mix, correcting and reminding Peter and the other disciples (yes, you and me too!) to do what they were supposed to do up there and simply listen!

By the time God had said it, the voices were gone, and the moment had passed. Out of all of the voices, there alone stood Jesus silent.

Jesus tells them to get up and go. Jesus' voice remained after the other voices left and his voice told them to get up and go back down the mountain to the holy work of being God's loving presence in this world unto the end. Jesus' voice would then continue to be present after he was not with them in person through what they said and did always, but when they had a hard time hearing it, they could also stop what they were doing, sit down again down for a few minutes and listen for it intently. As they listened, it would appear and dazzle again just like it did long ago.

On Transfiguration Sunday this year we will be listening to a voice that we might not be familiar with, a Spanish speaking voice. Rev. Jose Pilar Alvarez Cabrera will be joining us for worship and preaching in Spanish with another voice, Rev. Josh Ebener (Northern Illinois Synod Director of Evangelical Mission), who will be translating. Pr. Pilar will share his experiences as a bishop in Guatemala. He will share his story of becoming a refugee after speaking on behalf of indigenous peoples who needed their voices heard and how he made the journey to the Quad Cities to be the new pastor at San Jose Obrero in Moline. Pr. Pilar will also preach the gospel, which is the holy mountaintop good news of Jesus Christ which supersedes and overcomes all divisions, barriers, and obstacles to tell us something Good and True: that Jesus is God's Son, the beloved, lover of all.

May we listen to Pr. Pilar's story and to the gospel of Jesus Christ, which continues to call us to listen and then to get up and go. Vamos! Amen.

Spotlight On...Royal Family Kids Camp

Each month, we highlight a volunteer opportunity that has openings. This month, we feature a local opportunity with one of our partners in ministry, Royal Family Kids' Camp. Royal Family Kids' Camp is a 5-day camp that is held each summer for children ages 7-11 years old. Teen Reach Adventure Camp is a 3-day camp that is held each summer for children 12-15 years old.

Camps are designed for children who have gone through family-induced trauma or who are or have been involved with foster care or Social Services. Camp offers a unique opportunity for these children. A 2:1 camper to counselor ratio provides individual attention and the children feel safe, have fun, and experience unconditional love. They discover self-worth and a feeling of success as they accomplish projects and make friends. For them, camp has proven to be a life changing experience.

Camp activities include small group games, woodworking, craft projects, music, swimming, fishing, canoes, paddle boats and rock climbing wall. Lessons about God's love and care are taught through skits, puppetry and stories. Each night involves special entertainment such as pony rides or a storyteller. One night at RFKC is "Everybody's Birthday Party" complete with cake, games and presents to celebrate each and every child's special day. Each child leaves camp with a special quilt and a colorful pillowcase filled with their craft projects. They also receive a photo album with pictures of him/her at camp, so the positive memories can be recalled all year long.

There are many options for volunteering. Those 16 to 17 can volunteer as junior staff (great job and college reference). Counselors and staff must be 18 and have a heart for God and children. Some of the staff roles include Bible storyteller, song leader, coach, and grandparents. It does not cost the volunteers anything but their time and love for kids. We provide training and all housing and meals during the week of camp.

In 2024, RFKC in Henry County will be July 21-26. Now is the time to apply if you are interested in volunteering. For questions, and to apply to volunteer, reach out to Camp Director Wendy Townsend at rfkc.trac.geneseo@gmail.com or 309-507-1013.



Do you know how to fill in that blank? The students of QUEST do! It's WORSHIP. Those four elements, in that order, outline the pattern of WORSHIP in our Lutheran tradition.
