A WORD FROM THE PASTOR MATT

Ministry Opportunities in the QC

In mid-June we gathered with Lutherans from all over our region (synod) in assembly to do the work of the Northern Illinois Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church (ELCA) of which First Lutheran is a part. At the assembly this year, we passed a budget for 2024 and some resolutions, and we elected officers and committee members for the synod. The business that was conducted this year was pretty much par for the course. Those administrative tasks of the church are important and necessary and were done without any hindrances.

Now, I have always appreciated Synod Assembly not so much for those tasks, but rather for those stories of the church which come from people and places both known and unknown to me. Through worship, dialogue, and fellowship we connect to people and places both far away and nearby. We listen to perspectives which might challenge us and voice concerns and support when needed. We hear stories at Synod Assembly of how God's grace touches ordinary people's lives in really profound ways and how our giving impacts people all over the world.

One of the highlights of Synod Assembly this year for me came during Bishop Stacie Fidlar's report to the synod. During her report she introduced an exciting new opportunity for ministry between the Northern Illinois Synod and the Southeastern Iowa Synod with the Latino/a/e community right here in the Quad Cities. Bp. Fidlar welcomed the Rev. Jose Pilar Alvarez Carera to the stage to speak about this new ministry during her report and we heard his story.

Pr. Alvarez Carera will be serving as the pastor developer in two different congregations in the Quad Cities. He will be serving at one congregational new start in Davenport, Iowa at St. Mark Lutheran Church, and at Iglesia San Jose Obrero which meets at Trinity Lutheran

Church in Moline. In September of last year, Pastor Alvarez Carera, who had served as the president of the Guatemala Lutheran Church, moved to Davenport with his family. He was granted asylum after threats on his life due to his public advocacy for indigenous rights. It certainly was a highlight and a privilege to hear about his courageous journey of faith which led him here. He will be succeeding the Rev. Jose Cortez who is retiring after developing the ministry and serving at San Jose Obrero faithfully for the last 12 years.

In our work as pastors, we are always keeping our ears and eyes out for opportunities where this congregation can participate in ministry by helping our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. As we will certainly continue to hear more about this exciting new joint ministry and learn of their needs, may we be open to where God might be calling us to help and participate in this new venture. Spotlight On...Glory Ringers

Each month, we highlight an area of volunteer ministry that has "openings" for additional volunteers. This month is Glory Ringers, our bell choir. Current volunteers share about their experience:

Tricia Fuelling has been ringing with the bell choir for about 12 years. **Mark Schuler** joined the choir last fall.



- 1. Why did you decide to volunteer for this ministry? Or, why did you say "yes" when you were asked to serve?
- T: I started ringing when asked by my mother-in-law, Mary. It was a chance to get involved in something musical and provided some "me time". I had never really seen or heard a bell choir before I went to that first rehearsal!
- M: I wanted to be more connected to our congregation (livestream although very convenient with 2 small children, prevents this, in my opinion). Music is also very important to me as an outlet for expression.
 - 2. How is your faith strengthened by your work in this ministry?
- T: My knowledge of hymns has increased substantially, allowing me to connect more with my faith in that way. It provides a way to stay active and involved in church as well.
- M: Simply by playing growing up hearing the same songs and hymns, now being able to play them in a group, strengthens my faith. I also find comfort in the faith of the group.
 - 3. What might you say to encourage someone who is considering joining the team?
- T: Do it! I always say, if you can hold an ice cream cone and count to 4, you can play bells. Reading music is a plus, but many ringers don't know how to read notes when they start. It's accessible to all ability levels and a fun way to work your brain!
- M: Don't be shy! If you can read music, you can play!
 - 4. How do you get to participate in the work of "Sharing Christ's Love" by serving in this way?
- T: Sharing music with the congregation is always a blessing. As a group, we are always helping others strengthen their skills and encouraging each other.
- M: I feel Glory Ringers is a great way to use the gifts I've been blessed with to share with others.
 - 5. What do you like best about this work?
- T: It's a fun musical outlet and is always allowing me to learn new things.
- M: Perhaps the thought of setting an example for Chet and Hattie (my children) that each of us has an opportunity to give in our own way that is Christ-driven. And, oh yeah, the music too!

Glory Ringers play for Sunday worship about once per month, September thru May, plus some special occasions, and rehearse on Thursday evenings during the program year.

Beginning July 1, our Nursery Coordinator position is shifting from a paid position to a volunteer position. Lori Schefsky will remain in the position as the Nursery Coordinator, and continue doing the work she's been doing since the beginning of the year. Her position includes recruiting and scheduling volunteer Nursery Attendants, serving as a Nursery Attendant herself regularly (about once per month), and keeping the nursery tidy and safe.

Our Nursery, located on the first floor just off the Fellowship Room, is designed for children ages 0-2, and is staffed by volunteers on Sunday mornings during the worship hour. It is also open during other times, including Saturday evening worship, for families to use as needed.
