A WORD FROM PASTOR MATT

The Generations

They say a generation is a period between twenty to thirty years in length where children grow up into adults and then begin to have their own children. In our long history as people, each one of us has been created by others and then we in turn have created others. It's estimated that there have been about twelve thousand generations since the dawn of humanity. That's a lot of generations.

In the Bible there are lists of the generations of the faithful. People have joked with me that when they have sat down to attempt to read the entire Bible, they often get stuck in Genesis when the generations are named. I admit, that reading through those lists is not the most fascinating read, but the biblical writers thought it important enough to record the names of the ones who have come before to know where they are now. For our ancestors in the faith, it's their record of history, but also a remembrance of how God called them through the generations and how God still calls on them now.

In this church, I estimate that there have been about six to seven generations that have come through these doors since 1856, which is truly amazing when you think about it. What is amazing to me is that each generation has taken what was passed on to them and then built upon the work that began so long ago. Within this church you can see how the names and family histories have been recorded to remember the past and honor it for the future. One example of that is in our beautiful stained glass in the Sanctuary and in the Fellowship Room which bears names of loved ones who have helped build this place. Another example of that recording is the Archive Room at church which bears the names and faces (and so much more) of those who have come before us. Each one of us is a living story, testifying to the faithful generations who brought us here.

Our stewardship program this year is entitled *From Generation to Generation* and

it made me think about the generations of faith within my own family that have led me to you all. Now many of you already know that my dad served as a pastor for over thirty-five years, but you might not know that my grandpa served in ordained ministry as well along with many others in my family (uncles and aunts) who work in professional ministry. Maybe it was in the cards that I would go into ordained ministry, but since the get-go I have been surrounded by the church on all sides. In my early twenties, I was positive that my generation would not carry the torch of ministry, but it seems that God had different plans for me, that eventually led me to the call to ministry. As I look back on it now, I am thankful for the generations of the faithful that have led me to this work which I find to be fulfilling and certainly always interesting in the old ways and in the new.

What is your background story which led you here to be reading this newsletter article? I would truly love to know, because we all have a story about how God has led us to this place and how God has brought us through the generations. Now, some of us have deep histories in this particular congregation, and others have come here from elsewhere, but the fact remains that we are all here because God has led us here.

Part of our work as people faith is to build upon the work that has already been done here trying to be faithful to the past generations, while at the same time keeping an eye and ear toward where God might be leading us into the future that is not yet known. We hope and pray that you will consider how you and your generation can help to build upon the work of the generations that have come before, so that your children's generation, and subsequent generations will come to know God in Christ Jesus and His Love.

Spotlight On...Joyful Praise



Each month, we highlight an area of volunteer ministry that has "openings" for additional volunteers. This month is Joyful Praise. Current members of the praise team share their experience:

Chris Barnhart started playing drums at First in 2009. When he started it was a joint team made up of members from both Geneseo and Cambridge Lutheran churches. He has been a member of Joyful Hearts, Joyful Spirit and the Youth Praise teams, before Joyful Praise.

Lorrie Lord has been a part of Joyful Praise for a little over a year now.

- 1. Why did you decide to volunteer for this ministry? Or, why did you say "yes" when you were asked to serve?
 - Chris: For me, it was a way to participate in a Ministry which I felt a strong desire to do after completing my Via De Cristo weekend. At the same time, I was also looking for an opportunity to play with other like-minded musicians in an contemporary ensemble.

 Lorrie: Music as a means of worship has always been a focus of mine, and I was looking for a way to be a part of what, for me, would be something new Praise Music! I approached Melinda about the possibility of me playing my violin with the praise team, and she responded with enthusiasm to the idea. She and the entire praise team have been so supportive and welcoming from the very first rehearsal. I also felt that this would be a good learning experience for me as a violinist, as I quickly found out that the worship-band style of playing as a string player was not taught in the classical music setting!
- 2. How is your faith strengthened by your work in this ministry?

 Chris: It's just amazing to see when the music we play connects with and energizes the congregation. Of course, it's God's word that is lifting up the congregation, we are just conduits for that.
 - Lorrie: Leading worship with praise music strengthens my faith by being able to be a part of a team bringing God's message of grace, love, and forgiveness in a way that is different than the traditional hymns and liturgy.
- 3. What might you say to encourage someone who is considering joining the team? Chris: It's fun, and challenging, but rewarding at the same time. Also, the Praise team members are just great to work with.
 - **Lorrie:** I would encourage anyone who felt drawn to joining the praise team to give it a try. We have fun rehearsals, grow as musicians, and grow in faith by working together.
- 4. How do you get to participate in the work of "Sharing Christ's Love" by serving in this way? Chris: I get to spread the Word through music, which, as I mentioned, lots of fun. Lorrie: Sharing Christ's Love is what it is all about! In addition to playing violin with the team, I have at times served as a vocalist on the praise team as well. Some of the praise songs have lyrics that are quite powerful and have a way of speaking to the heart.
- 5. What do you like best about this work?
 - Chirs: I enjoying playing and it's a great honor and privilege to help craft the musical portions of our worship services.
 - **Lorrie:** "Joyful Praise" is a very apt name for our group. Being a part of this area of ministry has turned out to be something that has brought me much joy in unexpected ways!

Joyful Praise provides music for Sunday worship about twice per month, plus some special services. Musicians include instrumentalists (keyboard, drums, guitar, bass, and others!) and vocalists. A note on Godly Play

Closing and Feast

Towards the end of our Response Time, we gather the

children in a circle for storytelling from the Bible, and at the end for a feast, because they thereby learn about being in a community and working together. We respond to the work that was done and reflect on where God showed up that day. Everything we do in Godly Play contributes to learning. We gather all together in the Sanctuary for the last ten minutes to talk about important parts of the day, pray the Lord's Prayer, extinguish the candle, and then send everyone out with a high five, a handshake, or a hug.

We're on a Quest with the Creator!

Throughout October, the 6th graders in QUEST are considering what God says about CREATION, what God has created, and how God calls us to use our own creativity.

We began by noticing parts of God's creation that make us say "WOW!" The students brought artifacts to share, and we tried to see them as if for the first time.

A spectacular sunset. An apple. Puffy white clouds. The Eiffel Tower.

Paper and markers and our ability to use them.

We noticed that God's creation is good and beautiful and impressive ... and confusing and scary and mind-boggling! We decided God must be brilliant, caring, clever, imaginative, energetic, wise, and downright genius to be such a Creator. (All these are the 6th graders' words.) Surrounded by so much

awesomeness, we have no excuse but to love and care for what God has made. But we're human, and we mess up. A lot. Pollution, war, deforestation, bullying, greed ... these were just a few of the mistakes the 6th graders identified.

As the month goes on, we'll create something as a group: an entry for Geneseo's Scarecrow Row. We'll also be exploring QUESTions like this:

What things can you do to make a creative difference in this world?

How would YOU answer this question? We're all created to be creators, so we encourage you to get creative, too!
