A WORD FROM PASTOR LAURA

Season of Creation

Last year in August, our congregation tried something new – we celebrated the Season of Creation. Each weekend, we gathered for Worship centered on a creation-related theme. We celebrated the work of God Our Creator, who made all things good and who made us to be stewards of it all.

On the weekend of September 9 & 10, we will begin this year's celebration of the Season of Creation. Our themes for this year will be Forest, Land & Prairie, Wilderness, and River & Stream. Our worship texts and prayers, our hymns and songs, and our Scripture readings and preaching will all relate to these themes. Our worship will also be enhanced by the photos you have submitted to Melinda.

The resources we are using were developed by Norman Habel, David Rhoads, and Paul Santmire. Pastor Matt and I were fortunate to have Dr. David Rhoads as one of our professors of New Testament when we attended seminary at Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. A working group in our Northern Illinois Synod was formed by Pastor Jeff Schlesinger, in order to create resources that would be useful to all the congregations of our Synod. First Lutheran's Mission Endowment Fund granted a request to help fund the development of these resources. This month, we will experience the fruits of the labor of many faithful theologians.

For 48 weeks out of the year, plus our Festivals, we use the Scripture texts assigned by the Revised Common Lectionary, which is a resource used by Christians of many different denominations in many parts of the world. For these 4 weeks beginning September 9 & 10, we will use the Scripture texts assigned for the Season of Creation. In some cases, the readings are longer or shorter than we may be used to. The chosen text's connection to the theme may not be evident at first glance, but if Pastor Matt and I do a good job of preaching, the connections will become clearer.

The Season of Creation is a time to give thanks and praise to our Creator, naming specific aspects of the magnificent Creation. We also confess and lament the ways in which we humans have misused the gifts of Creation. We pray for Creation, especially in places where it is most broken. We receive God's forgiveness and we are sent back out into Creation to witness to and participate in God's healing and restorative work.

I am praying for our congregation as we prepare for all the things that September brings: a return of Faithtime Kids and Faithtime Meal, First Book Club and First Friends, Sanctuary Choir and Glory Ringers, Preschool classes, and the Season of Creation. I am praying for the Holy Spirit to inspire each worshipper to bring our heartfelt praise for God, our sincere repentance, and a readiness to trust in God's restorative and life-giving work in our world, through our Savior Jesus Christ.



Godly Play: No Single Way To Learn

In Godly Play, our Faithtime Kids program for children ages K-5, we tell stories with multisensory materials to appeal to a broad range of learning styles: *auditory* because the story is spoken out loud; *visual*, because the handmade wooden figures represent what is happening in the story; *kinesthetic*, because the storyteller moves the materials around. Later, any child who wishes to learn to tell the story can respond in the same style. In *"response time*," those children who work best together can pair off or form groups to work on creative projects. Those who work best alone have the time and space to concentrate on projects by themselves. We gather the children in a circle for the storytelling, and at the end for a feast, because they thereby learn about being in a community and working together. Everything we do in Godly Play contributes to learning.

The Jenny Lind Chapel will host its annual Högmassa (High Mass) worship with the Rev. Wayne Miller, retired Bishop of the Metropolitan Chicago Synod, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Bishop Miller is a graduate of Augustana College, Rock Island, (Bachelors in Music Education) and the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago.

After he was ordained in 1984, Miller served as assistant pastor of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Chicago, and the pastor of the Augustana Center for Developmentally Disabled Children until 1986. He was associate pastor of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, Naperville, Ill., from 1986 to 1994, before he was called to St. Mark Lutheran Church, Aurora.

Pastor Miller served St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Aurora, Illinois from 1994 until his election as Bishop of the Metropolitan Chicago Synod in 2007. He retired in 2019 and has served as an interim pastor in several congregations in the past few years.

Bishop Miller and his wife, Pam, are being honored this year by Lutheran Social Services of Illinois at their 42nd Annual True Friends Celebration in October.

LWR Personal Care Kits

Lutheran World Relief provides Personal Care Kits each year to those in need due to natural disasters, war, violence, and civil unrest. In 2022, over 94,000 kits were distributed in 12 countries, including Ukraine, Syria, South Sudan, and Haiti. We are collecting *light-weight dark color bath towels (must be no larger than 52 x 27, dark color recommended), adult-size toothbrushes (multipacks are acceptable), sturdy combs, and metal nail clippers.* Each kit also contains two bars of soap, which we have already. Items can be placed in the baskets at the display in the Fellowship Room through September 10.


