FOOD COLLECTION (October) - Manna on Main Street

Items especially needed in restocking their pantry are:

condiments and spices, cereal, baking powder, baking soda, cake and cookie mixes, icing, canned mushrooms, olives, canned beets, spinach and asparagus, quinoa, couscous, barley and whole grain pasta.

General non-food needs include:

diapers, baby wipes and baby hygiene items (shampoo, lotion, powder), size 6 and pull ups, toilet paper, tissues, paper towels, laundry detergent, razors, deodorant, shower gel and hand soap, feminine care items, conditioner and hair brushes, cleaning products (bathroom cleaner, window cleaner, dish soap), lotions, lip balm, Vaseline.

General food needs include:

spam, canned ham, canned seafood, canned soups, dried fruit, tomato sauce, diced/whole tomatoes, pasta, rice, oatmeal, pancake mix, peanut butter and jelly, dried/canned beans, baked beans, canned carrots; **NO green** beans, corn or black beans (blessed to have plenty); gluten-free and low-sodium; heart healthy products are useful.

Contributions may be dropped off at the church office (Tu,W,F) 9 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and at the Fellowship Hall on Sundays. <u>Dates on food items MUST be current.</u>

Operation Christmas Child

We are thrilled to share that our church packed a total of <u>132</u> Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes this year! (This is an increase of over 25% from last year's total!) Thank you again to the many people who helped make this happen - we could not have done it without <u>YOU</u>!



We are still collecting spare change to put towards shipping costs if you would like to help contribute. At this point, we are about halfway to our goal of providing funding for all 132 boxes. Each shoebox costs \$9 to ship, and not only does that money get the box around the world to its final destination, but it also helps for shoebox recipients to receive the word of the Gospel in their native language.

Empty milk cartons for collecting change are still available in the <u>RED</u> bin on the table in the inner Narthex. *Milk cartons (no matter how full) can be returned to the <u>GREEN</u> bin on the table in the Narthex and are due back <u>NEXT Sunday, October 20</u>. 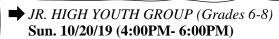
